### **Interim Superintendent Named**

Three Rivers School
District is pleased to
announce that David
Valenzuela has been
selected to replace
David Holmes as the
interim Superintendent
effective July 1, 2016.

Valenzuela was chosen from two finalists after interviews held during a board executive session Wednesday, May 11. The school board reviewed candidate



applications with the assistance of a screening committee which included administrators, staff, and community members. The board formally appointed Valenzuela at the board meeting on May 17.

Valenzuela has served as Three Rivers School District's Director of Curriculum & Instruction, Technology, and Federal Programs for the past four years. Having attended Three Rivers schools throughout his childhood, Valenzuela has been associated with the district for over 37 years in various capacities, working in maintenance, teaching middle and high school, and working in administrative capacities at all school levels and the district office.

Before taking his current position, he served as Principal at Evergreen Elementary for six years. He has also served as Assistant Principal at Lincoln Savage Middle School for two years, Assistant Principal at Eagle Point High School for one year, and taught multiple subjects for Fleming Middle School and Illinois Valley High School for six years. Valenzuela holds a Masters of Arts in Secondary Education degree from Southern Oregon University, and a Bachelor of Arts in Secondary Education from Western Oregon University.

"Three Rivers School District has helped to shape me into the person I am today," says Valenzuela. "I am passionate about the success of this district, our staff and, most importantly, the students we serve. I am resolute in the decision to serve as Superintendent over the long haul in an effort to return to it a portion of what it has given to me."


## Hidden Valley Athletes on Signing Day
