Compensatory Revenue “Hold Harmless”


The Governor’s initial budget proposal creates a “Hold Harmless” formula



Would result in a reduction of \$485,000 compared to current law



Compensatory revenue gets allocated 100% to staffing so initial staffing was done using the lower allocation amount



Results in a reduction districtwide of 6 FTE

- The number of students increased by 251, or 8.9%, from the 2023-2024 school year to the 2024-2025 school year
- Reallocated 7 FTE within the compensatory holdback allocation
- Added an additional 6 FTE out of projected SPED revenue increase
