From the Desk ofDave Holden, Kindergarten Teacher


Every year in Kindergarten, it is exciting to see the students begin to write their thoughts. In the fall almost all can create illustrations of their thoughts, but by spring students are communicating with letters as well.


Becoming an author—writing what we want others to know—takes consistent practice for all of us. Giving students reasons to write helps motivate them. In our classroom we spend most of the year writing books that connect to our weekly theme. The students become interested in writing because of activities and stories that relate to their lives whenever possible.

As summer arrives; I would encourage all of us to give our children reasons to practice their writing skills: If you have pets, keep a journal about their growth. If you take a trip, record a favorite activity each day. You could also e-mail or post a letter to a friend or relative. Making lists of summer projects or activities would be great practice as well. You might want to keep a daily log of the weather or temperature. Encourage your kids to write notes to family members as another form of communication. (Do something like using a secret code or hiding place for messages!)...Enjoy coming up with your own ideas and happy writing!
