Our teachers are enjoying "Teach Me Tuesdays" professional development. Teachers stay after school and enjoy different topics to enhance their teaching.

For Guidance Lessons, the counselor presented the book "It's OK to be Different" by Todd Parr and talked about being accepting of other's differences, and did a short lesson on "Poisons" as part of our Drug Awareness Program. We sang a song with the ukulele called "It's OK to be Different" (to the tune of "The Wheels on the Bus") with the students making up lyrics about differences. Some of the verses the students came up with were about wearing glasses, having different skin color, and wearing different clothes.

We also talked about the character trait "Service" in morning assembly. As a way of teaching our students about the trait of service we came up with our Christmas activity, "Santa's Workshop, A Night of Service" where each grade level is making a different product to donate to people in the community. For example, fourth grade is making lap blankets from fleece for the Nursing Home, and the second grade students are making small pillows for the residents of the State School in Denton.

In the Classroom:



This December in language arts, we will continue to learn the sight words: said, was, had, play, for, they and have. We have now mastered all of our letters and we are beginning to blend them and use them in our journals to make words and complete sentences. Comprehension and reading groups have begun with book readers sent home daily, and writing independently will become a huge part of each day! We will continue to build on what a verb is and a noun and begin learning what the vowel letters are. In math, we are graphing and learning our teen numbers. We are using our 10 frames to count and show teen numbers, comparing numbers, and writing them.

December is so much fun for our sweet kindergarteners. It's a time for giving, good character, and making memories. We are collecting toys for our toy drive and working on our character goals every day. At our winter open house each grade level made items for those less fortunate. Our kindergarteners will learn and appreciate the value of Christmas by giving to others in need.

Our TEKS for social studies will have us learning about the different ways people celebrate Christmas around the world, and the festivities and traditions that go along with this winter holiday. Science will go hand in hand with Christmas as we discuss and learn about winter in December!



Run, run! As fast as you can! You can't catch me - I'm the gingerbread man!! For the month of December, first grade learning at Brockett is all about the gingerbread man. We will be summarizing and retelling different versions of "The Gingerbread Man." In writing workshop, students will be writing their own version of the story. They will take their learning to a higher level with the prompt: "What would you do if you were the gingerbread man?" The first grade doors are decorated as gingerbread houses for our December open house. Brockett is connecting character education to the math TEKS for our open house. Students and parents will be measuring and making scarves for a local homeless shelter in Denton.



Second grade is finishing out the calendar year strong. We are learning to write letters, including one to Santa. In math, we are studying money and its value. In reading, we are studying idioms and prefixes and suffixes. We are discussing natural resources and life in the colonies in social studies. We will be making pillows on our Christmas celebration night to take to the State School. We have a Christmas breakfast planned as well.



A lot is happening in third grade at Brockett! In math, our students are learning how to create & use representations of fractions to organize, record and communicate ideas. We continue to use our interactive math manipulative notebook each week. These notebooks provide the student with manipulatives and definitions. The student then creates examples of their own for their

notebook. Students and teachers are excited to be a part of creating lap blankets for the elderly for Christmas. Students used measurement and fractions, and other math concepts to get the materials ready for the lap blankets to be assembled.

In ELAR, students are learning about Expository Text. They are studying different types of expository text and text features. Students are in the process of writing their own expository text based on an experience they had on their field trip to the Perot Museum. Third graders are becoming better writers and readers by studying words and their meanings. Right now in language arts, students are learning that some words have more than one meaning and how to use context clues for word meaning.

In social studies, we are studying the connection of human capital/labor, income, spending and saving. This unit will involve studying and making budgets for needs and wants.

In science, students are learning about landforms and the physical changes that can take place in our environment. We continue to use our science journals to observe and track data.



Fourth grade hall has been busy! We conquered 2x2 digit multiplication and 3 digit x 1 digit multiplication. Students are now learning about fractions and then all operations. Students continue to learn how to analyze math and relate it to their world. Students will be learning about communities and giving back to their communities. They will be making lap blankets for area nursing homes. The students had a successful canned food and toy drive. They were proud to be giving back to their community. We will be learning about non-fiction in reading and working on different skills in our reading groups. Students enjoyed the guest author and illustrator that came to our school. He spoke of overcoming challenges in life and working hard to pursue your goals and dreams. In science, we will learn about earth's natural resources and how we can help take care of it.
