Trustee Cezar Martinez read the following statement: "The Robstown ISD Board of Trustees welcomes comments from citizens on any agenda items or non-agenda items at a regular board meeting. Those wishing to address the school board must provide their name for the record and observe a three-minute time limit. During this time, the Board of Trustees may not respond to the citizen's concerns as per the Texas Open Meetings Act." Adan Barrera asked the Board and superintendent about bringing positivity to the community and helping the student-athletes connect those dots to progress their education and athleticism. Holly Bockholt implored the school board members to deny Avina's request for property tax abatement for a proposed ammonia plant. The area was not an industrial area. Martin Zurick expressed his concerns about the water that would be needed to run the plant. He asked them to look into the long-term effect it would have on the community. Maria Lucio expressed her concerns about no abatement for Avina because it was not good for the community. Avina was just the beginning because they are now looking into hydrogen also. Avina would just take the communities' water, and pollute the air by discharging chemicals into the air. Also, she asked them to follow up on the company, if they did approve the abatement. Alma Studer expressed her concerns about the Avina Plant and asked them to carefully consider their decision as a Board. Bette Cranford expressed her concerns about how ammonia was very toxic. She explained to the Board what had happened to a small community when it was

exposed to ammonia. She asked them not to expose the children of Robstown. Myra Alaniz expressed her concerns about other schools giving tax abatements and they are not in a better state. She encouraged the Board not to increase Avina's profits by giving them all of these tax abatements.

Diana Silvas reported that on Wednesday, April 17, 2024, a medical emergency occurred at the DAEP Campus. The staff exemplified courage and recognized an emergency. Tonight with profound gratitude and administration she presented the Lifesaving Award to the following school district employees: William Dean, Belinda Trevino, and Candice Ramirez for their selfless acts of bravery. Their quick thinking and decisive actions embody the very essence of heroism. #### 9A ACADEMIC UPDATE

Adriana Tagle reported that they have been working on the data dashboard which would allow them to share qualitative data aligned with the pillars. TEA released the accountability manual for 2024 on May 9<sup>th</sup> and they will be putting in the new changes into the academic update. She presented the percentages for failing one course, percent failing two courses, and the percentage for failing three courses from first to twelfth grades. On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of this month, they will receive the preliminary results on who passed and who will be retested. Also, she highlighted how the students were doing in the MCLASS for grades kindergarten, 1st, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grades. A workshop for parents on how to find their child's scores on the school district's website will be scheduled soon.

#### 9B ATHLETIC UPDATE

Gage Perry reported that they had two student-athletes that participated in the state track meet. Nyomi Garcia placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the eight hundred and third in the 1600 hundred. Trinity Anscomb placed fourth in the long jump. The following students have signed: Nyomi Garcia signed with Texas State to run track, Madison Pinon to TAMUK to run cross county and Derik Silva will sign with Dalton University on May 14, 2024, to play football. They will be having two military signups and they are also athletes. They have promoted Johnny Sanchez as the new defensive coordinator and Mark Garcia as a coordinator from within their staff. Currently, they have been hosting several play-off games and they have received high reviews on the use of the field. The Little Picker relay was canceled because of the hot weather but it was rescheduled for tomorrow at 9:00 a.m. at the football field.
