High School Programming

Block program

High School Students who are severely credit deficient and/or are severely struggling in the regular education environment work toward credit recovery in a highly differentiated classroom at their own pace. Students also participate in service learning, AODA instruction, and critical thinking. There is a strong focus on development of 21st century skills. Students receive a regular Tomahawk High School Diploma.

GEDO2 program

High school students who meet the qualifications take all of the GED tests (or complete required credits in that academic area), as well as complete health civics, personal finance, employability skills, critical thinking, and service learning requirements. There is a strong focus on development of 21st century skills. Students are limited to 3 attempts to pass the GED tests. Students receive a regular Tomahawk High School Diploma with the transcript showing requirements met by competency.

Middle School Alternative Education Block Program

The block program focuses mainly on behavior, but will include aspects of academics and underachievement as well. The program will include relationship building, goal setting, self advocacy, adaptability, critical thinking, social emotional skills, employability skills, lifetime fitness and health, guided academics, and project based extension activities. Students also participate in service learning and work on independent project based learning. There is a strong focus on development of 21st century skills.

During the 10-11 school year, middle School students who were struggling in the regular classroom attended a guided study hall 1 hour per day for small group assistance with homework, as well as received instruction in school success skills such as organization, time management, and planning and goal setting.

Middle School Check In

Check in focuses on relationship building, goal setting, and self advocacy/resource identification. Students will meet with the alternative education teacher or facilitator one on one or in small groups for 15 minutes once a week. As students meet goals and demonstrate independence, this time may decrease.
