 - Connected data to practices and clear, consistent expectations
 - Groups identified gap groups, patterns, and areas to explore further
 - Each building reviewed how the information affects classroom and building goals.
 - Teams focused on whether practices, expectations, routines, and procedures reflect what the data showed.
 - Teams created priority statements based on the relevant data observed during this inquiry
 - Each building came out of the day with the following:
 - Building goals which may include grade level, content, and classroom goals/expectations
 - Measures of the success of the priority statements/goals
 - Determined action steps
 - Identified resources they have or need
 - Identified how this will be reflected in their Building Strategic Plan
