DISCUSSION ITEM: Consideration of Approval of the District President, or his

Designee, to Monitor Pricing Offered by Certain Retail Electric Providers and Execute an Electricity Supply Contract Deemed

in the Best Interest of the District

DISCUSSION: On January 1, 2002, the deregulation of the electricity markets

in the State of Texas became effective. Since that time, residential and commercial electricity consumers have had the

right to choose their electricity supplier (known as Retail Electricity Providers or REP's) based on the economics of the contract offer. The REP's generate or procure electricity that energizes the transmission and distribution system (the "grid")

that is managed and controlled by the Electric Reliability

Council of Texas ("ERCOT").

Collin College has engaged the services of an electricity consultant, Energy Edge, to assist in the evaluation of openmarket electricity offers. Currently, the College contracts with the Texas General Land Office ("GLO") for the purchase of electricity to supply electricity for all of the College campuses. The contract with the GLO expires on April 30, 2022.

At this time, it appears that forward contract pricing for fixedprice electricity deliveries to begin May 1, 2022, is very favorable compared to the current contract price of \$0.03884 per kWh.

Because of the constant change in electricity pricing, contracts offered by the REP's have a very short window for acceptance. For that reason, this request is to authorize the District President, or designee, in consultation with Energy Edge, to monitor electricity pricing and execute an electricity supply contract beginning May 1, 2022, if such a contract is deemed to be in the best interest of the District.
