Dear Fruitdale Families,

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Our year is off to a great start. Our staff is working tirelessly on meeting the emotional, educational and social needs of each and every student. The students are the pride of Fruitdale and we are doing our best to support each and every one in order to maximize their greatest potential.

Fruitdale receives federal funds for Title One programs. Our Title One program predominately focuses on reading, math as well as other school-wide programs. All Fruitdale students receive 60 minutes of at grade level instruction in math. In addition, our students receive an additional 30 minutes of math instruction aimed to remediate, intervene, or enrich based on the individual's needs. Fruitdale students have similar opportunities in reading. We are excited about the individual progress each and every student is making and will continue to make individual student growth our school-wide goal.

Fruitdale is a PBIS school, focusing on positive reinforcement and teaching expectations. All students and staff will follow basic expectations for the school: Be safe, Be responsible, Be respectful, and Be positive. Not only can parents support us by reinforcing our PBIS guidelines at home, you can also support us in making sure your child is eligible for our 1<sup>st</sup> trimester PBIS reward activity. In order for students to meet eligibility requirements they must accomplish the following:

- 1. Students must have 4's or above on the behavior portion of the report card for the current quarter (This includes homework).
- 2. Students must maintain a 92% attendance average. Students in grades 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> may have no more than 3 absences per quarter. This will equate to approximately 1.5 days for Kindergarteners due to the part time schedule. (4 tardies will equal 1 absence).
- 3. Students must be in good standing at the library. Mrs. Marr will check for lost books and unpaid fines.
- 4. Students may have **no** office referrals for the quarter.
- 5. Students may have <u>no</u> suspensions off the bus for the quarter.
- 6. 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grades only must have 100% of their AR goal for the quarter. Students must also maintain an 80% average on comprehension tests.

Please understand that attendance is a crucial component to academic and school success. Simply put, if they aren't here, we can't teach them! We have several students missing each and every day. We also have a significant amount of students who are tardy. Many of our reading and math instructional classes as well as double dose opportunities begin first thing in the morning. Please make every effort to ensure your child is in class ready to learn by 7:35 (8:35 on Fridays).

I look forward to working with each of you to provide the best educational experience possible for your students. I hope to see you at the Harvest Festival on October 30<sup>th</sup>. Heather Yount Principal

# **CHANGES & ADDITIONS**

Please notice the following information as we begin a brand new year:

- 1. Fruitdale will continue to provide a free breakfast to all students. This year, Fruitdale will also be providing a free lunch to all students as well.
- 2. Our bell rings at 7:35 on Monday through Thursday, please have your students dropped off by this time. If your child is planning on having breakfast at Fruitdale, please allow extra time when planning your morning drop off routine.
- 3. The Three Rivers School District has moved to a Late Start Friday Staff Development Model this year. Every **Friday**, school will begin one hour later. Please have your students here by 8:35am, when our first bell rings.

#### Parking Lot Safety at Fruitdale

Many of you drop off your student at the beginning of the day and/or pickup your student at the end of the day. I am sure you are well aware our parking lot is a very busy place. As a staff, we are making extra effort to try and have it flow as smoothly as possible. We continue to need your help to make this happen.

#### Drop Off:

When dropping off your student in the morning, please use extra precautions. Our student drop off area is located in the front of the building. Please pull all the way forward. We have several parents who stop right at the curve in the front of the office. This causes cars to have to pull around to navigate past the curve. If you pull all the way forward towards the fifth grade hallway, we are able to allow more students to be dropped off at one time.

If you need to escort your child in for any reason or you would like to drop something off in the office, please remember to park inside a parking spot. Our student drop off area is not for parked cars. This will enable the smooth flow of cars in and out of our parking lot. Thank you for being extra cautious regarding this rule.

#### <u>Pick-up</u>:

Please understand we are trying to release students as safely and quickly as possible. With over 365 students, many of which are picked up, our parking lot at the end of the day is going to take some patience.

When picking up your child at the end of the day, we have several parking spaces available as well as a waiting area for cars in our pick-up zone in the front of our building. These places fill up quickly. If there are no available places inside our parking lot, please pull over on Bill Baker Way, this will enable us to maintain a flow of cars in and out of our parking lot. When picking up your student, please pull over to the curb and pull forward as far as you can. This will enable a lane for cars to still get by.

Above all, I am asking that we are all patient in the parking lot. Our goal is for pick-up and drop-off to run as smoothly and safely as possible.

## **Fruitdale Library and Garden News**

We had a very successful Library program this summer. There were 136 individual visits, 732 books checked out, and 131,760 minutes of reading were logged! Summer readers read for at least ½ hour per day and also chose another activity like: *reading to a pet; working in the garden; doing a craft project; writing a poem* or *painting a picture*. We had a raffle for two Android tablets capable of accessing the Library2Go through Josephine Community Libraries. Raffle winners were Cole Christian and Summer Joulsohn. Congratulations!

I have been working very hard for the last two years to buy books and materials that will complement the new **Common Core State Standards**. During the past year, I weeded 899 obsolete books – many dating from the 1980s and 1990s. I added 1,713 books. Right now 4,507 of the 16,148 are non-fiction. I was able to donate my obsolete books to Better World Books. They donate millions of books to literacy programs all over the world. I am happy that our books will be used in that manner!

Our new high quality library bound books are very expensive. They average a cost of \$20.00 per book. You, our Fruitdale families, have helped a tremendous amount to enable these purchases. Your patronage at our **Scholastic Book Fairs**, your participation in **eScrip**, the money your students spend at the student store on **Smencils**, Japanese erasers, and your **Box Top** donations all help to fund the library.
