I want to push the JFC on increasing special education funding in the next biennial budget. Annually we transfer funds from our General Fund (10) into our Special Education Fund (27). Currently we are reimbursed at approximately 33%. The goal would be to have this increase to 60%. I will be attending the spring WASDA conference in Madison April 23-25. Hopefully we will receive some information on the direction the Dept. of Education is headed and federal funding for public education. I have been working with our 6-12 guidance counselor, Emily Stauty, on our high school course description book. The goal is to have the board approve the course offerings at the May board meeting.
