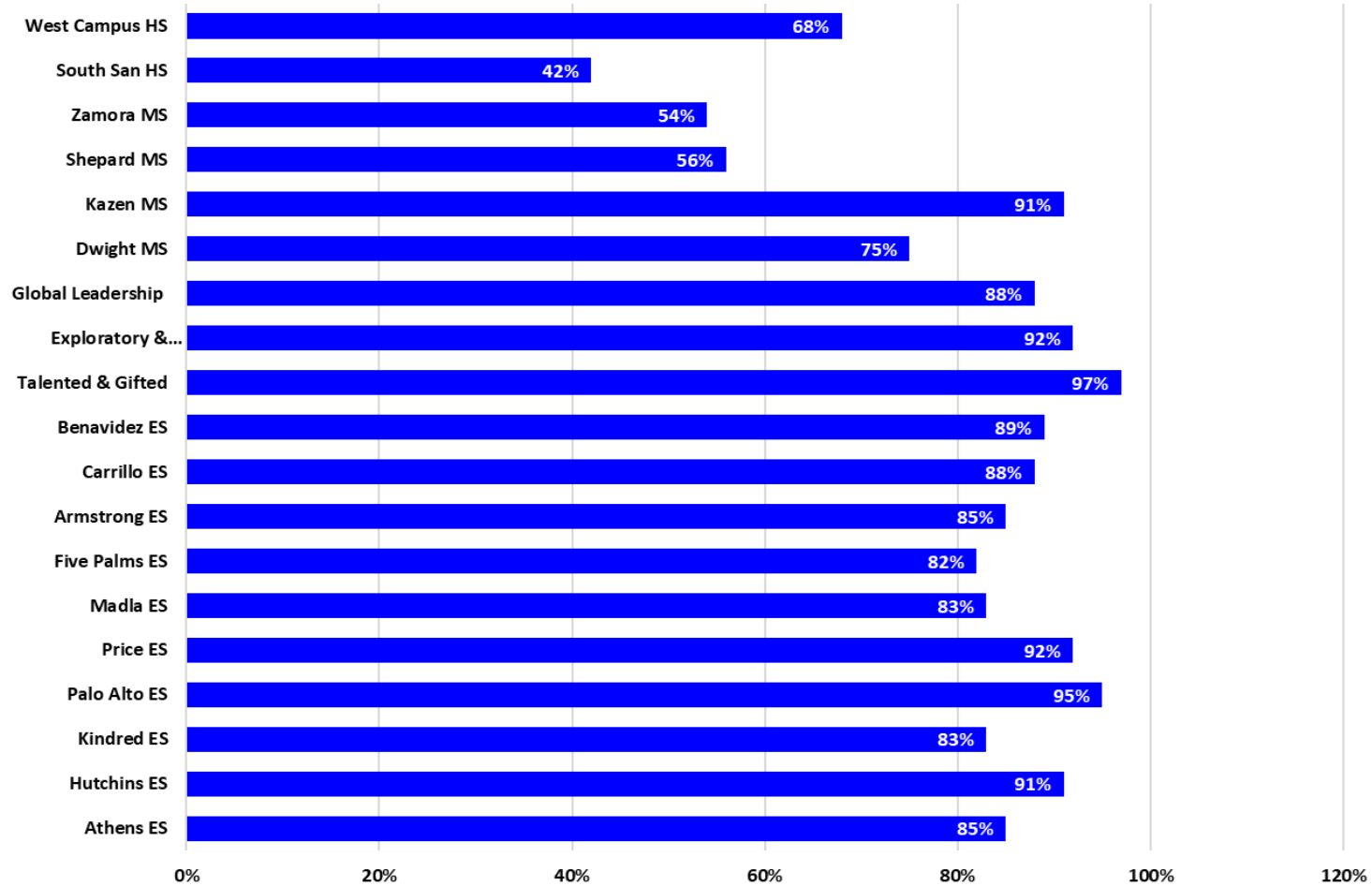

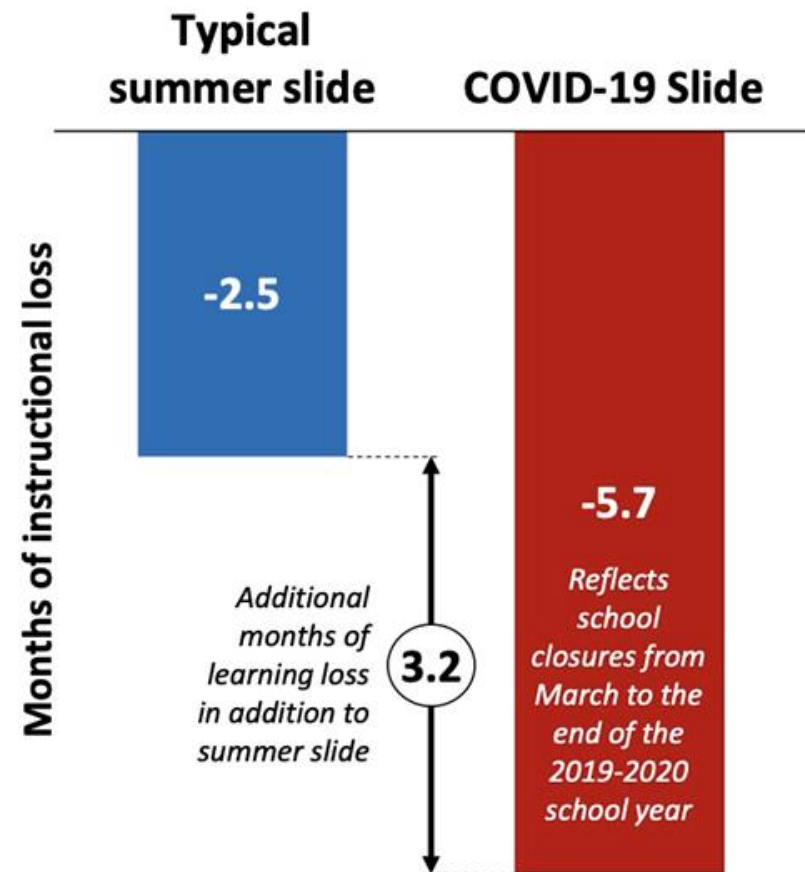
Highlights:

- ❖ All secondary campuses have a significant increase in the percent of students passing all subjects.
- ❖ Total percent passing increased by 13% overall

TEA Statewide Findings

Given Beginning-Of-Year Data, We Are Facing Even Larger Challenges This Time Around

With COVID, the number of students below grade level is likely to increase dramatically.



Statewide Trends

- ❖ As a result of the learning disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of students **not meeting grade level** increased from 2019 across all subject areas and grade levels, with English I and English II being the only exceptions.
- ❖ As a subject area, mathematics reflects the largest decline in proficiency across all grade levels.
- ❖ Districts with the highest percentage of in-person learners largely avoided any learning declines in reading.

To Catch Kids Up, Schools Must Make Significant Changes
