District Goal: Responding to the Needs of all students

**Critical Element:** Providing early and frequent academic interventions to ensure all students are at grade-level benchmarks. Build a collegial and collaborative culture through data-informed PLCs and team structures.

Specific Goal: By June 2026, Pendleton High School will increase the percentage of freshmen on track for graduation from 82% to 90% while reducing chronic absenteeism among 9th graders by 10%. This will be achieved through improved teacher collaboration, early academic and attendance interventions, and strengthened family and community partnerships.
