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DHS Cellphone Policy Data Analysis

In the 2023-2024 school year Dixon High School instituted a new cellphone policy. In the policy, students were required to put their electronic device into a classroom caddy/holder at the start of the period. Students were required to keep their device in the caddy until their teacher permitted the use of cellphone/devices.

The following is an analysis of referral data for cellphone/electronic devices over the last three years.

- In the 2021-2022* school year, cellphones accounted for 10% of all referrals
 - Hybrid and alternating attendance scheduling due to the pandemic
 - o 178 total infractions
 - Class of 2023: 31 infractions (3rd highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2024: 60 infractions (2nd highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2025: 87 infractions (3rd highest infraction of class)
- In the 2022-2023 school year, cellphones accounted for 10% of all referrals
 203 total infractions
 - Class of 2024: 33 infractions (3rd highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2025: 60 infractions (4th highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2026: 110 infractions (2nd highest infraction of class)
- After instituting the new policy, cellphones accounted for 5% of all referrals in the **2023**-**2024 school year**
 - 118 total infractions
 - Class of 2025: 26 infractions (5th highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2026: 28 infractions (8th highest infraction of class)
 - Class of 2027: 64 infractions (4th highest infraction of class)

In summary, the implementation of the new policy saw a 50% decrease in cellphone/electronic device referrals in the first year of its implementation dropping from the 2^{nd} (2022-2023) and 3^{rd} (2021-2022) highest infractions to the 4^{th} highest in 2023-2024.
