

Napi Elementary Board Report December 2018

Principals Report-Mrs. Bird

November was busy, busy! However, it was a good busy, as it was very productive!

On November 6th, U of M Western Faculty visited classrooms of their past 2+2 Teacher Program candidates and filmed lessons being instructed. The faculty were extremely proud to see the transfer between instruction and content knowledge in the college classroom into high level instruction in the educational classroom. Mr. Well's, Mrs. DuBray's, and Mr. Armstrong's classes were selected for this visit and had parts of their day filmed.

Picture Day was held on November 8th. This event was organized by Ms. Flammand and it ran very smoothly.

November 9th, we hosted our 1st Quarter Award Ceremony. It was a privilege to recognize our students for their accomplishments in front of their peers, parents, and teachers. Due to the delay in the school day because of weather, Good Behavior certificates were not presented at the ceremony, however these students were pulled together for a group picture. The group pictures were submitted to the Glacier Reporter to ensure these students still received public acknowledgement.

Parent Teacher Conferences were hosted on November 6th and 8th. Attendance percentages for all grade levels were the following: 4th--65%; 5th--64%, and 6th--49%. Mrs. Bragg's and Mr. Armstrong's classrooms were awarded a pizza party for obtaining 90% or higher attendance rate!

Family Night was hosted on November 15th by Mr. Berthelson, Mr. Bryant, Ms. Sangray, Mr. Armstrong, and Ms. B. Augare! The turn out and the feedback from those that attended was very positive. I thank all of these staff members for going above and beyond!

Two-hour grade level professional development sessions on ELA and Math Strategies were provided to teachers by OPI Consultants on November 14th and 15th. In order for this opportunity to take place, it takes 100% of the staff working together to cover classes! Both of these days went smoothly as a result of great teamwork and effort!

On November 20th, Mrs. Renee Tatsey invited all Napi Elementary Students to the Blackfeet Board Dormitory to tour the new facility. During the tour, Mrs. Tatsey explained to students the opportunities and services that are provided during the week to students that attend the dorm. It was great to see many students coming back with applications that would benefit from the support services that the dorm offers. The same week, the first SBAC ELA Interim assessment was

administered. This data was examined by teachers on Wednesday, December 28th at Extended Wednesday. All teachers agree their data showed students' are not yet prepared to write constructive responses at the level required for students to earn 1-2 points on the SBAC. We will continue to address this concern through SLT and Grade Level data team-meetings.

Napi's SLT Team met on November 1st and 29th to progress monitor action plans and update the continuous improvement cycle. We see there are items that still require action and at this time, feel we need to identify priorities and table items that aren't priorities. I appreciate the team coming together every month to collaborate and makes decisions that are best for our students.

Finally, Mr. Earl Tail and Mr. KickingWoman presented the Holiday program to staff. We are very thankful and excited for this year's program! (Please see attached tentative program invitation.)

Coaches Report- November (Mrs. Wagner)

November was a busy month for the coach and staff. The coach was available to staff and parents for any questions regarding the ISIP and STAR status of students. On Nov 12, the coach and principals were to meet with OPI staff, but the meeting was rescheduled to Tuesday morning instead. Napi hosted PD for each grade level in staggered schedules for two days - one for ELA to begin focus folders implementation, the other for math strategies, fluency, and problem

solving. Both trainings were provided for by our consultants Misti Woltz and Mary Buck. On November 19, students took the interim SBAC ELA assessment. The principals and the coach will begin analyzing the data received so that we can target specific areas for improvement. The coach has also begun to analyze data from weekly formative assessments per grade level. There are currently 5 active coaching cycles open and 2 more to be added in December.

Counseling Center--

November has been very busy in the counseling center. During this time, all 6th students have received both QPR and SOS Training to make sure they know the warning of signs of both suicide and depression as well as what to do to help out friends who might be in need of help. Character Education classes continue daily for all 4th and 5th grade students using the 2nd Step Curriculum. Skill such as how to join into activities were taught in the classroom units.

In addition to the instruction, the Napi Counseling Center continued to serve the daily crisis and social emotional counseling needs of Napi students.
