We were able to raffle off some prizes and ended the night with karaoke. We are thankful to our friends at ConocoPhillips for donating food and decorations for the event.

We currently have five students participating in dual credit courses through Ilisagvik College.

On August 25<sup>th</sup> whaling crews left, and we were there to see them off! We prayed with the community for a safe a prosperous hunt. It was a beautiful site, especially for our new staff members. Crew 57 returned on Monday, September 1<sup>st</sup> and teachers were welcomed to participate as the crew prepared the muktuk.

Following suggestions from our community, we decided to create a middle school wing this year, which separates our middle school and high school students. Because of this, middle school students are able to have additional time during the school day to receive targeted interventions in reading and math. We feel this will help students develop academic and social-emotional skills to help them be more successful upon entering high school.

High school students are actively working on their Tumitchiat Sivunmun plans during their advisory period, with support from the counselor, advisory teachers, parents, and community members.

We are making it a priority to decorate the school with photos and artifacts from the community.

## Goal 4: Graduate bilingual students

We are incredibly fortunate this year to have both an elementary ILT and a secondary ILT. We welcomed new secondary ILT Mrs. Michelle Ipalook to our staff this year, and her students have already been busy plucking geese in her classroom. Students in grades 8 -12 receive 50 minutes of Inupiaq language instruction each day. Our veteran ILT Bernice is providing 35 minutes of Inupiaq language instruction to students in grades ECE - 7.











### Student Social & Emotional Wellbeing

Goal 5: Facilitate & maintain culturally, emotionally, & physically safe learning environments

We are looking forward to our first Fun Friday event of the year on September 26<sup>th</sup>. Fun Friday is part of our school-wide PBIS initiative and allows students to build positive relationships with adults in the building.

We plan to utilize our calming room this school year for any student who needs time to calm down and decompress during the school day. The calming room is located in the library and contains books, social-emotional learning workbooks, sensory toys, art supplies, and flexible seating designed to help de-escalate students.

Our school counselor, Ms. Danielle, will be conducting individual and group counseling for students with emotional and/or behavioral challenges.

Teachers are using Class Dojo to reinforce positive behaviors in the classroom and common areas of the school. Students receive points for attendance, kindness, and diligence.
