Our Bold Vision + Purposeful Path

Retain & Recruit

Quality teachers and staff in every classroom, position

- Increase starting teacher pay to \$60,000
- Increase starting pay for paraprofessional positions to \$16/hour
- Increase starting pay for auxiliary positions to \$15/hour
- Increase all other professional positions by 3%
- Adjust pay steps and salary scales
- Deploy Retention Initiative: Strategic Stipends
- Increase district contribution to healthcare premiums


Fast-Growth Programs

Budget Efficiency

Central Office reductions total \$1,430,000 to date

Departmental Non-Payroll

- Reduce central office budgets by 10%
- Discontinue/reduce various contracted services
- Reallocate state approved instructional resources to IMAT






Property Values in Boerne ISD



Despite significant market value growth, growth in taxable values has been limited by property tax legislation and supplemented by steady new property growth



Historical Tax Rate Information







- Homestead exemptions will increase by \$40k from \$100K to \$140K
- Over 65 and disabled will increase by \$50k from \$10K to \$60K
- Over 65 will receive the benefit of both homestead increases at \$90k

Notice of Voter-Approval Rate

The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.0009.

This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the voter-approval rate of \$1.0009.
