Presentations/ Recognitions Ravin McCallum, Bettye Myers Middle School counselor was named January's Educator Spotlight. Depending on the student or situation, McCallum fills in as big sister, best friend, soccer coach and counselor. It's this special bond with students that makes McCallum a campus favorite.

Students from Blanton Elementary and Houston Elementary will represent the Denton Independent School District at the Organization of American Kodaly Educators national convention by performing with the organization's national children's choir in Oklahoma City in March. OAKE was founded in 1975 and is a teaching concept that works to train basic musical skills and teach the reading and writing of music while integrating the best ideas and techniques to spread music education. Its purpose is to promote the concept of "Music for Everyone" through the improvement of music education in schools.

The Denton Independent School District had 14 students from Braswell and Denton High recognized by the Texas State Thespian Convention for being among the top students in their craft. Braswell High School was named a Texas Thespian All Star Troupe, one of only 10 schools from more than 300 that earned that distinction. In addition to their all-star troupe honor, Braswell qualified five students for the national convention.

The Denton Independent School District had four students – all from

Guyer High School – recently by the Texas Art Education Association's annual state Visual Arts Scholastic Event. The VASE award is one of the highest honors a student can earn, with each of the state qualifiers scoring by a panel of judges on artistic critique and an interpretive interview and must have scored a "superior" rating of four to qualify. Additionally, three of the four students earned Gold Seal status. The Gold Seal is the highest honor an art student can achieve and of 35,000 works of art submitted only 150 received this honor.

Mike Donnelly, Mayor of Town of Double Oak and is also a member of the Citizen's Advisory Bond Committee introduced Mr. Jim Carter a US Navy Veteran, and former Mayor of the Town of Trophy Club and is a candidate for Denton County Precinct 4 Commissioner.

2018 Citizens' Advisory Committee Bond Recommendations Dr. Jeff Williams and Lauren Baccus, Co-chairs of the 2018 Citizens' Advisory Bond Committee presented the committee's recommendations to the Board of Trustees. The Advisory Committee was made-up of 56 residents from a diverse cross-section of the District. The committee was charged to assess and prioritize the district's current and long-term facility needs. The Advisory Committee used five grading factors to prioritize projects and assign each project a score. The factors were Urgency/Need; Benefit to Students; Equity; Value; and Benefit to Community. The committee unanimously agreed on growth projects, aging facilities projects, CTE projects, extracurricular projects and infrastructure and safety projects. The Committee recommended for the Board of Trustees to consider calling a Bond Election for \$750 million to be on the May 5, 2018 ballot.
