#### WORDS FROM MR. CROWSON.....

Recently I was honored to attend a presentation by Detective Micah Smith on making technology safer for school and kids. Not only did his presentation open my eyes as a parent, it opened my eyes as the principal of Lorna Byrne Middle School. His message made a strong impression on me and how to better educate my own children. Below are 6 important tips in making your son or daughter a better educated and safe user of technology in your home.

### Tip #1: Limit Computer Access To A Common Room

A recent study (2005) by the Pew Internet and American Life Project found that 65% of all parents and teens say that teens do things online that they wouldn't want their parents to know about. By keeping the home computer in a common area of the home where people frequently view or pass by the monitor kids are less likely to engage in dangerous or risky internet behaviors. ### Tip #2: Agree on Rules, As A Family, For Internet Safety

In a recent finding in a school district in Oregon, nearly every student from 4<sup>th</sup> grade through 12<sup>th</sup> grade had created a My Space account after knowing their parents would not approve of it or had been told not to visit that website. Have you told your children never go to MySpace? Have you ever checked to see if they were listening? These accounts can be accessed almost anywhere these days. Monitoring can be a challenge with computer access available in places like the library or even a phone. Agree on terms as a family and have your children help set the parameters and the consequences. The more ownership your kids have in the development of the rules the more likely they are to act responsibly.

# **Tip #3**: Discuss What To Do If Something Makes Them Feel Scared, Uncomfortable Or Confused

There are billions of helpful and informative websites available for people to browse and research. Along with the Billions of helpful sites there are an equal number of sites that inappropriate, vulgar, explicit and possibly scary (especially for students at the middle school level). Talk with your children about what is acceptable and what isn't. Most importantly encourage your kids to confide in you. If you have questions a website or questions about someone trying to communicate with your son/daughter contact law enforcement immediately.



#### **PBS in LBMS**

The 2008-2009 school year is almost two-thirds complete, and LBMS students are showing themselves to be Responsible, Respectful, and Safe.

As a staff, we focus on those students making good choices. The result is a positive climate where everyone is looking for students doing well.

Currently, over 75% of our students have Gold Cards. What does it mean to have a Gold Card? Gold Cards are the ticket to participation in special activities that occur daily, weekly, and by trimester. Students are encouraged to keep their Gold Card on their person at all times. Gold Cards are needed for admission to the gym during free time. Some of the upcoming Gold Card events include: Cocoa, popcorn, snow cones, cotton candy, and spontaneous treats for Gold Card students during lunch break.

Our students enjoy the Electronic Lunch, which is bringing games, phones, etc. to the library during noon break, if they have a Gold Card. Each trimester, the Gold Card students are awarded a special event, such as swimming at the YMCA, going to a movie, bowling, Family Fun Center, or a barbeque at the beach. We will choose from one of these each trimester to award those students who strive to make Lorna Byrne a positive place to get an education.

In addition, we have "Lorna Byrne Idol" contests. Students sign up to compete with one another during lunch break using a karaoke song of their choice. We narrow down the field to semifinals, and then finals, which are held in front of the student body. This has been a great way for our students to demonstrate their amazing musical talents. We are looking at expanding our lunch competitions to dance, talent show, or possibly a Rock Band competition. All of these activities provide our students with a variety of ways to explore their creativity.

The positive climate, which grows as a result of these activities, builds team spirit and a sense of belonging.

We are proud of the students and staff at LBMS, who work so hard to make this a great place to be.

# TITLE 1 PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS AT LBMS

Our school receives federal funds for Title One programs that are part of the No Child Left Behind Act. Under this law, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s). If you request this information, the district will provide you with this information in a timely manner. You have the right to request the following information:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher is providing instruction.
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived
- The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degrees and certificates
- If your child is receiving Title One services from paraprofessionals and if so, his/her qualifications

**Tip #4:** Know Who Your Children Talk To Online.....And How

Would you care who your kids were hanging out with at school? What about after school? Why stop caring when they are communicating online or with their phone? Some parents have adopted the philosophy "Don't talk to people online you don't know in real life." Help your children evaluate who is a good friend choice and who isn't. Limit this type of communication to those people both you and your son/daughter consider good friend choices.

# Tip #5: Learn To Set Parental Controls and Filters

Most mainstream web browsers have web filtering capabilities as do many brands of computers and computer programs. If they don't you can also purchase or download filters to help limit access to certain types of websites. All the filters in the world cannot stop your children from accessing poor websites away from home too. Along with all of these tools it is important to educate your kids about safe, unsafe, appropriate and inappropriate uses of technology.

#### Tip #6: Educate Yourself

Have you ever wondered how MySpace works? What about Facebook? Instead of wondering about these websites educate yourself! Sometimes the best teachers are your kids. There is nothing wrong with sitting down at the computer with them and having them show you what they know or exploring the website together. Chances are you will be very impressed with what their level of technological expertise. In just a few sessions you will have a greater understanding of what these website hold and how they can be beneficial in their life if they continue to use it properly.

#### STUDENT ABSENCES AND EXCUSES

Daily attendance and punctuality are absolutely necessary for a student to gain maximum benefits from his/her educational experience.

Oregon school law supports the Board's view, and restricts excused absences to illness of the student, student medical or dental appointments (confirmation of appointments may be required), illness in the immediate family which requires the student's presence at home, when the tenets of the student's religion require an absence for religious observance of a holiday or emergency situations that require the student's absence. All other absences must meet the approval of the school officials or be treated as unexcused absences. An absence that does not meet the criteria of an excused absence but has been confirmed by the parent will be marked as a "verified" absence.

Absences will only be excused or verified if a phone call is received from the parent/guardian the day the student is absent or a note received in the school office not more than 3 days after the child returned to school.
