TEA Eligibility Qualifications for PreK

Child must be at least three years of age or four years of age on or before September 1 and must meet one of the following criteria:





Limited English proficiency









Employee Children

Employee children may participate in full day PreK-3 or PreK-4 for a \$500 per month fee. (Sept-June)



MISD Early Childhood Programs 2024 - 2025

PreK-3 classrooms at Chapel Park, Hewitt, Park Hill, and South Bosque (89 students - 4 classrooms)

PreK-4 classrooms on all elementary campuses (223 students - 11 classrooms)

Early Childhood Program Highlights

- Teacher professional development, coaching, and mentoring is focused on early childhood education
- Participation in Special Classes (P.E., Music, Art, Library)





Early Childhood Program Challenges

- Enrollment for eligible PreK-4 students continues throughout the school year.
- As enrollment grows, students are overflowed away from their home campus.
- Full-day funding from the state is received for PreK-4 students, but PreK-3 is funded half-day.
- It is crucial to provide a PreK-4 student to staff ratio at 22:2 (1 teacher, 1 para).
- A ratio of 24:3 is recommended for PreK-3 (1 teacher, 2 paras), creating a waitlist for PreK-3 students.



Future Plans

- Realign PreK-3 classrooms for 2025 2026 to meet enrollment needs while maintaining a total of four classrooms.
 - 1 classroom each will remain at Chapel Park, Hewitt, and South Bosque
 - 1 classroom will transition from Park Hill to Spring Valley
- This change allows for a balance of PreK-3 and PreK-4 sections on campuses throughout the district.
- Continue the transition that began last year from **free full-day** to **free half-day** program for students who qualify for PreK-3. Families who would like to attend full day are able to pay \$300/month.
