



What does the Equity Policy language call for?



What does the Equity Policy language call for?

Equity Leadership and Infrastructure: The Superintendent shall develop and recommend to the Board both a viable long-term plan for funding, staffing, and implementing activities and initiatives to achieve the equity objectives as well as annual updates. This plan shall include a leadership team and infrastructure as well as regular reporting that coincides with the budget cycle. The recommendation shall include an ongoing process that includes opportunities for teachers and staff, students, parents and guardians, community members and Board members to provide input on the implementation of this Policy on at least a quarterly basis and assist the Board in monitoring outcomes and communicating implementation and results with the community, which shall be informed by the implementation planning process that shall occur from the effective date to the implementation date of August 2019. The position of Senior Director of Equity shall continue to be part of the senior management team and report directly to the Superintendent.



A higher tier means the district is closer to Adequacy and therefore requires and receives less state assistance






Approximate Rank Order for D97






Between 2012 and 2022, Instruction represents the largest portion of expenditures at D97




Illinois School District Averages - Expenditure Percentages By Function (FY 2012-22)

Illinois School District Averages - Expenditure Percentages By Function (FY 2012-22)




The percent of D97 expenditures by area is fairly similar to the statewide averages



District Financial Information - Revenue Percentages (FY 2012-22)


Between 2012 and 2022, local funding has increased as a percentage of D97's revenue while state funding has decreased





Illinois School District Averages - Revenue Percentages (FY 2012-22)

School Finances: Site-Based Expenditures

Average spending per student at each school in the district, as collected through the unaudited Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Site-Based Expenditure Report. Districts report the actual dollars spent in the previous school year, including site-level costs (like school staff) and districtwide centralized costs allocated to each individual school (like transportation and central office staff), divided by the school's enrollment. Districts also report whether federal or state/local sources funded the spending. Learn More ~





Operating Expense Per Pupil -District Finances:

e 6 of 10

Average spending per student in this district, based on financial data collected in the audited Annual Financial Report. ISBE calculates instructional spending and operational spending and divides both by the district's student count. Instructional Spending Per Student includes only the activities directly dealing with the teaching of students or the interaction between teachers and students. Operational Spending Per Student includes nearly all costs for overall operations in this school's district, including Instructional Spending. Learn More 🛩
