## Pre-K

This week in pre-K, we will continue learning about families, how pets are a part of some families, and how we, as pet owners, can and are responsible for taking care of our pets. We will also be exploring the job of a Veterinarian. In math, we will be learning counting strategies such as, one-to-one correspondence. In literacy we will continue looking at letters and describing their attributes. We will practice putting compound words together and taking them apart. Lastly we will practice retelling familiar stories.--

## Kindergarten



#### 1st Grade

In math we will continue learning how to use objects and pictorial models to solve word problems involving joining, separating, and comparing sets within 20 and unknowns as any one of the terms in the problem. In Knowledge we will begin the week testing on unit two; Human Body Systems. We will then begin unit 3, Fairytales on Wednesday! In this new unit we will learn to describe the plot elements including the main events, the problem, and the resolution for texts read aloud and independently. In Skills we will demonstrate and apply phonetic knowledge by decoding words in isolation and in context by applying common letter-sound correspondences. In Science we will explain and predict changes in materials caused by heating and cooling.

#### 2nd Grade

This week in Math we will be learning about modeling base ten numbers within 1,200 with money. This will put us halfway through Module 3 and we will take a mid module assessment. In Skills we will be reading from our grade level reader, Bedtime Tales, focusing on plot elements and key details. This week's tricky words: are, were, some, they, their. The phonics skills are bossy r, /oi/ and /ou/ sounds. We will be planning, drafting, and editing a fictional narrative. In Social Studies we will identify and use information on maps and globes using basic map elements.

### 3rd Grade

This week in Reading, we will take our assessment over Unit 2: Animal Classifications, and publish our animal writing. We will also begin Unit 3: The Human Body. We will read about the skeletal and muscular system. We will use our text to identify key ideas and use text evidence to respond to our reading. In Math, we will continue to compose numbers to 100,000 as so many hundred thousands, thousands, hundreds, tens, and ones. We will also compare and order numbers up to 100,000 using symbols. In addition, we will round numbers to 10 and 100 and estimate solutions to problems. In Social Studies, we will identify writers and artists and how they identify the cultural heritage in communities.. In Social Studies, we will identify properties of matter. It's going to be a great week in third grade!

#### 4th Grade

In ELAR, students will start Unit 3 and begin reading *Letters From Heaven*. As they read, students will practice making inferences and ultimately explain the interactions between characters and the changes those characters experience.

In Social Studies, students will identify and compare the ways of life of American Indian groups before European exploration.

In Math, students will practice how to use input-output tables and numerical expressions to create number patterns. They will be learning how rules generate a sequence and how each number

They will conclude our unit on physical properties this week, with the unit assessment scheduled for **Thursday and Friday**.
