5th Grade

Math- Students are learning the order of operations. They will also continue developing an understanding of algebraic expressions and use this understanding to solve algebraic equations. They will be finishing up the month with an introduction to decimals to the thousandths.

ELAR-In ELAR they are working on story elements, summary, character analysis, and vocabulary. They are also discussing the difference between fiction and nonfiction. To promote fluency, vocabulary and story elements they are reading the play "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow"

Science-They are working on physical science unit. They are discussing how to describe matter through physical properties to include, mass & weight, relative density, magnetism, conductors & insulators, mixtures

Social Studies-They are using the new USA Studies Weekly.

6th Grade

ELAR- Students have been reading expository texts. Alexander the Great, a biography and Land of the Red Apples, an autobiography. Students have also been using the writing process to write their own autobiography, as well as, a biography of a family member. They just finished up their first C-Scope test.

8th Grade

Science students are starting their last chemistry unit. They will be comparing and contrasting elements, molecules, and compounds, identifying balanced chemical equations, also explaining conservation of matter in chemical equations and reactions.

English students are wrapping up the first nine weeks by writing essays based on Mark Twain's autobiographical short story, "Cub Pilot on the Mississippi." Students took their first istation assessment for the year. The students have been working very hard and it is reflected in their scores.
