Refinancing of 2007 General Obligation Bonds Results in Significant Savings for Property Taxpayers March 9, 2021

REFINANCING OF 2007 BONDS. On Tuesday, March 9, the Board of Trustees adopted final Bond Resolutions in the process of refinancing the Districts' 2007 General Obligation Bonds outstanding in the amount of \$2,225,000 for the Elementary and \$1,490,000 for the HS to take advantage of currently low interest rates.

SAVINGS FOR ELEMENTARY AND HS TAXPAYERS. The overall reduction in debt service from the Bond refinancings totaled \$378,236.34 (\$225,985.61 in the Elementary and \$152,250.73 in the HS). School officials are pleased to provide significant savings to local taxpayers. Property taxpayers will experience lower annual debt service levies over the remaining 6.5 year term, which ends on July 1, 2027.

RECORD LOW RATES. The interest rate of the new refunding Bonds is 0.69% as provided by Madison Valley Bank as the low bidder. The 2007 Bonds that are being refinanced have an average rate of approximately 4.35% and so in all the Districts' General Obligation Bond rates will be reduced by 3.66% (or a reduction of 84%).

THE ORIGINAL 2007 BONDS The Series 2007 Bonds were originally issued in the principal amount of \$5,000,000 in the Elementary and \$3,350,000 in the High School as part of the project to construct the new high school and utilize the old high school for elementary purposes.

The only other Bonds issued in 2007 for the new High School project were Impact Aid Revenue Bonds in the High School District in the original amount of \$3,045,000 and those Bonds were refinanced in 2015 for a savings of
