

- Agencies involved
  - Oregon DEQ
  - Oregon Department of State Lands (DSL)
  - Army Corps of Engineers (COE)
  - National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS)
  - State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)
- Final permits issued by COE and DSL
  - COE requires NMFS, SHPO, DEQ approval back to them
  - COE conduct own review and allow for public input
  - COE then issues permit to build in wetland
  - DSL reviews and issues separate permit to build in wetland



- DSL review status
  - Application submitted 2/20/15, deemed incomplete
  - Competing data submitted on 3/30/15
  - Will respond by no later than 4/30/15
  - If application complete will have 30 day public notice period
  - If no appeal, permit 60 days after notice period (7/29/15)
- DEQ review status
  - Reviewing storm water plan
  - Application submitted 2/20/15
  - Typical review 6 months; expected approval 8/2015
  - Proceeding on plan to date



- NMFS review status
  - Also review storm water plan
  - Application forwarded by COE around 3/1/15
  - Approval expected around 5/15/15
- SHPO review status
  - Received application from COE on 4/17/15
  - Archeological consultant declared no historical impact
  - Approval expected around 5/17/15
- COE review status
  - Application received 2/20/15
  - Announced and held Public Notice Period
  - Will forward public comments by 4/24/15 to BSD
  - Target permit issue date 8/2015



- Potential appeals
  - DEQ public comment directly opposing project
    - Mitigated through DEQ public hearing
    - Unilateral decision; generally fits within 6 mo. Review period
  - DSL appeals
    - 21 day appeal period starts after permit granted
    - Hearing generally 30 days following appeal
    - Work in wetlands (only) may be suspended until hearing is complete; case dependent



- Best current forecast of permit outcome
  - Tualatin Riverkeepers may appeal
  - If appealed, resolution timeframe not determinable
  - BSD and consultants best current forecast is that permits will be obtained 8/2015 if no appeals
- Impact to project during an appeal
  - If wetland permit appealed, remainder of site work could proceed
