Oregon's Budget in Broad Strokes: Types of Funds




- General Fund:
 - Personal income tax
 - Corporate excise/income tax
 - Some other taxes (e.g. estate tax, portions of cigarette/tobacco tax & liquor apportionment)
 - At discretion of Legislature
- Lottery Fund:
 - Many constitutional and statutory spending requirements
 - Debt service
 - ~ 40% at Legislature's discretion
- Other Funds:
 - Typically fund specific programs
 - Fees charged by state agencies
 - Corporate Activities Tax, Marijuana Tax, Gas Tax, etc.
- Federal Funds
 - Mostly for specific; federally-directed purposes
- ★ Property Taxes are not state revenue, rather funds go to local taxing districts such as cities, counties, school districts/ESDs, community colleges, and special districts

2023-25 Legislatively Adopted Budget \$121.261 Billion Total Funds 3.6% Decrease from 2021-23 Approved Budget



Education's Share of Discretionary Spending

2023-25 Legislatively Adopted Budget \$33.491 Billion General Fund and Lottery Funds 17.2% Increase from 2021-23 Approved



Improvements to Current Service Level: Moving the Starting Blocks



- Rolling up from 51% of biennial allocation (vs. 50% historically)
 - Estimated \$217M increase
- Updating the salary estimate model to better account for historical error rates
 - Estimated \$243M increase
- Account for annual local revenue changes
 - Estimated \$55M increase

Total Anticipated Increase of \$515 Million, Puts CSL at Roughly \$11.1 Billion
