

FPC Rahll Campus Board Report November 2026

- ESL and GED Spring I classes started this week. We anticipate around the same enrollment as last semester.
- TCOLE Advisory Board quarterly meeting was held on January 21st.
- Met with Dr. McNabb, CDL Theory Instructor, regarding spring classes.
- Frank Phillips College staff attended a tour and a meeting at the Dalhart Prison Unit. Met with staff and discussed upcoming courses.
- FPC staff attended an in-person security training in Amarillo on November 20th and 21st to complete the training required to provide services to the students in the Prison Education Program.
- Enrollment for Spring 2026 increased significantly for dual credit enrollment. Channing, Texline, and Dalhart added a Diesel Technology pathway. Sixty-four students are enrolled. The Rahll Campus had several students' complete coursework in the fall as well as several who transferred to a university. We are pleased with the spring enrollment.
- Mr. Gene Rahll passed away. He will be missed in our community. He has created a legacy. We are so thankful for his generosity and for his unwavering support of Frank Phillips College.
- EMT students completed their coursework and have started taking their National EMT Certificate Exams. As of today, all five students who have tested have passed on their first attempt. Advanced EMT will begin in late February.

- Attended meetings with local school districts for planning 26-27 school year.
