Each district is to conduct a class enrollment survey of Kindergarten through Grade Four (K-4) no later than September 10, 2010. Based on class enrollment surveys for Grades K-4, Class size limits do not apply to physical education or fine arts classes.

The waiver request must be submitted to TEA (Commissioner) no later than October 1, 2010 or 30th day after the first school day the district exceeds the limit, along with this compliance (if plan was previously submitted); and specific reasons that noncompliance must be addressed. In addition, districts that request a waiver due to an inability to employ form include a copy of a current compliance plan that has been approved by the local board of trustees. The plan must include the name(s) of campus(es), campus rating, grade (s), and number of sections exceeding a 22:1 class size ratio; steps to be taken to bring the district into compliance; timeline for completion; any new efforts/progress toward teachers must document efforts to recruit and hire staff.

United Independent School District Compliance Plan

School Year 2010-2011 – Submission 2 (previously submitted 11-18-2010)

United Independent School District continues to experience student enrollment growth; therefore, the district persists in its recruiting efforts, construction of additional campuses/wings, relocation of portables, and the constant evaluation of boundaries and student demographics. Beginning the 2009-2010, the District will cap "high growth" campuses that exceed the 22:1 ratio.

Trautmann Elementary (240-903-110) TEA Exemplary Rating:

1 section in first grade over the 22:1 ratio

The district has taken the following measures to assure that this campus is in compliance with class size requirements:

- the district will continue to work closely with the district's demographer to review district wide growth to plan accordingly;
- the district will relocate portable buildings to campuses with over-projected enrollments;

Barbara Fasken Elementary (240903-131) TEA Recognized Rating:

7 sections in 3rd grade over the 22:1 ratio

In January, the district received a resignation from a third grade teacher. Rather than hire a new teacher, the class was dispersed among the other 7 classes.

The district has taken the following measures to assure that this campus is in compliance with class size requirements:

- the district will continue to work closely with the district's demographer to review district wide growth to plan accordingly;
- the district will relocate portable buildings to campuses with over-projected enrollments;

Bonnie Garcia Elementary (240903-128) TEA Recognized Rating:

1 section in kinder over the 22:1 ratio

The district has taken the following measures to assure that this campus is in compliance with class size requirements:

- the district will continue to work closely with the district's demographer to review district wide growth to plan accordingly;
- the district will relocate portable buildings to campuses with over-projected enrollments;

Killam Elementary (240-903-132) TEA Acceptable Rating:

1 section in 4th grade over the 22:1 ratio

The district has taken the following measures to assure that this campus is in compliance with class size requirements:

- the district will continue to work closely with the district's demographer to review district wide growth to plan accordingly;
- the district will relocate portable buildings to campuses with over-projected enrollments;

Other steps that the district has taken include:

- District staff and demographer are currently reviewing potential growth affecting our schools.
 Changes to boundaries will be made based on these findings.
- The district has established a "Tomorrow's Teachers" Program. This program addresses the need for qualified teachers in all areas of education and plans to meet the challenge by "growing our own" teachers from the talented pool of United I.S.D. students.
- The District is currently reviewing budget allocations to plan accordingly.
