Robotics


Robotics Update #1

All three teams (The Argonauts, The Menacing Muffin Dragons, and The World's Smallest Team) have been working so hard to create functional robots that can move, pick up objects, launch paper airplanes, and even haul themselves into the air! Programmers are working on autonomous programming where the robot moves itself, and tele-op programming where the robot is controlled with a game controller (but that movement still needs to be programmed to the controller!) Coaches, strategists, documentarians, artists, writers, web designers and social media experts are all working to make sure that their team is thoroughly documented - dressed in team t-shirts, and otherwise ready for competition. Our second meet called Meet 1 will be on November 11th at Hillsboro High School from 12-6PM. Competitions are open to the public if you would like to come and cheer us on.

Robotics Update #2


Saturday October 28th was our first meet of the season for NKN Robotics. Three teams traveled to Hillsboro High School for the first of five league events between now and February.

Yesterday our three teams competed against 12 teams from around Northwest Oregon.

One of my proudest moments - might be that my teams were some of the first to complete robot and field inspections. They came prepared and ready to compete!

The Menacing Muffin Dragons had a very successful start to their season ranked 3rd out of 15 teams at the meet. They were actually the first team in our league (partnered with our Argonauts team) to complete the first mosaic of the season - placing three tiles on the backdrop in a particular orientation/color grouping. It doesn't look like much, but it was an impressive moment. The 47 points they earned in that round set them up early for a strong showing.

The other events are on November 11th, December 9th, January 6th, and February 3rd.



Their team name, like their shirts, are a lot of fun - each one will have a dragon of a different color on them eventually- Josiah's is red - Chloe's hasn't gotten painted yet




The Argonauts also had a solid showing at the meet. They ended ranked 6th out of 15 teams. Their unique Gecko Grabber wasn't quite as fast on the pickup as they would like, but teams were pretty impressed with the innovative design, and a replacement grabber is already built, and just needs to get swapped out. One team mentioned that, "Our coach has been trying to get us to design something like this since the beginning of the season!" The Argonauts are very enthusiastic, and did a great job involving all our teams in actively connecting with other teams at the meet. This culminated in Cat Fry talking strategy almost the entire bus ride home last night.



I am looking forward to practices this week - to see students put into practice changes that will improve their performance in November. Also, the Argonaut shirt design is fantastic. Our next goal is to get our robots in the air unfortunately we are missing one component which is out of stock at GoBilda, and until it returns we can't build our Lead screw system. Hopefully that part will come back in stock and we can get those built!







The World's smallest Team, or TWsT for short, struggled quite a bit yesterday. They ranked as high as 5th in the competition, but ended in 12th place out of 15 teams. That being said, they did very well considering the sizable challenges they faced. They had a brand new member who had attended only one practice. They were missing a number of other competitors due to sickness or other scheduling conflicts. In spite of that they competed hard in all 5 of their rounds.

simplest and most innovative paper airplane launcher design and other teams came over to see it, and were super impressed with how it works. A simple pin on a string is pulled out of 3D printed plane mount by a small servo motor, and a rubber band provides the energy to send the mount down a rail until it stops suddenly at the end and sends the plane aloft. Unfortunately the endgame period of 30 seconds proved to be quite short, and getting queued up to send the plane flying proved difficult. They had a couple memorable mis-fires including one that sent the plane into the lap of one of the opposing alliance members. (This is one of the reasons we all wear eye protection at these events.)

It was lovely to have so many mentors, families, and friends show up to cheer on our teams yesterday, so thank you parents, siblings, grandparents, mentors, and families of mentors for showing up!

Note from the Nurse

Vaping and Stress


Students that vape often report that they do it to relieve stress, as a way to cope or to feel better with their anxiety. A temporary relief can be felt when using nicotine by vaping or smoking. However, over time, nicotine adds to your stress levels. Nicotine addiction happens quickly, where the body requires more and more nicotine to feel the same temporary pleasurable affects. When that pleasure feeling fades, nicotine withdrawal symptoms set in, increasing stress levels. Cravings increase as the body needs more nicotine to feel "normal" again. Teens who smoke or vape regularly experience more

feelings of stress than teens who do not. If you want to talk about vaping or alternate ways to reduce stress, make an appointment with your school nurse or counselor.

Parents/Guardians---talk to your students about vaping. Early and often conversations are important. Let the school know if we can support these conversations started at home.

Important Medication Reminder

High school students are not allowed to have any prescription or over-the-counter medication in their possession (inhalers are the ONLY exception to the rule).

District policy states, "...unlawful drug also means possession, use, sale or supply of prescription and non prescription drugs in violation of Board policy..."

The penalties for possession of unlawful drugs may include, but are not limited to...

First Offense

- 1. Police notified
- 2. Third-part drug/alcohol evaluation
- 3. Up to five day suspension from school
- 4. A two week activity suspension, including all school-sponsored activities athletics and extracurricular events will be enforced.

Second Offense

- 1. Police notified
- 2. Third-part drug/alcohol evaluation if more than 12 months have passed since prior evaluation

- 3. Up to ten day suspension from school
- 4. Five week activity suspension, including all school-sponsored activities athletics and extracurricular events will be enforced.

Third Offense

- 1. Police notified
- 2. Recommendation for expulsion

Again, students in possession of **ANY** medication (including cough drops, vitamins, acetaminophen, etc) other than an inhaler are considered to be in possession of unlawful drugs and are subject to disciplinary action.

Please do not send **ANY** type of medication to school with your student. High School parents are required to sign a permission form and deliver or pick up **ALL** medications in person.

Please also not: **ALL** medication must be in the original container. Prescription medications must also have the student's and doctor's names and directions clearly marked on the pharmacy label. The label must include the name of the drug, date, dosage frequency, and method of administration.



In light of the pandemic and issues some students have faced with meeting their graduation requirements, the Neah-Kah-Nie school board decided to reduce graduation requirements to 24 credits. This is a reduction of elective credits needed for graduation for the classes of 2024. Those students who have completed graduation requirements are encouraged to stay and explore additional classes, take college courses or participate in job shadows and internships. We thank the school board for providing an equitable option for our struggling students and celebrate those students who go above and beyond to prepare for their futures!

Having a diploma is an important step in preparing students for future success. The knowledge, skills and habits a student develops while being in school, help to prepare them for success as an adult. Developing good study habits and working on self-management skills are an important piece of being successful, both at school and at work!

Be on time to class...turn in assignments on time...phones off and away during class - these are all expectations teachers have of students that directly relate to the world of work.

Students who are struggling or are not currently on track to graduate should be encouraged to stay for after-school study hall to complete homework assignments or to make up classes needed for graduation. A little bit of work now can have some huge payoffs for the future!
