Proposal for Adoption of Illinois Snapshots of Early Literacy (ISEL)

Purpose: To replace DIBELS with the ISEL for the primary grades (K-2) to provide teachers and administrators with snapshots of early literacy behaviors to better inform instruction. The ISEL can be used as a Universal Screener, diagnostic measure, progress monitoring tool and pre/post assessment to gather information regarding effectiveness of reading instruction.

ISEL Information: Please see the attached document that provides detailed information regarding the ISEL assessment along with screen shots of the web-based scoring and reporting features.

Training: 4.5 total days

August $17^{th} - 2$ half-day sessions (1 day total)

- AM Session K-1 teachers (46 teachers)
- PM Session 2nd grade teachers (23 teachers)

Follow Up Training after administration of ISEL (teachers and principals)

- 1 half day per grade level after first ISEL administration (3 days total)
- 1 half day for grades K-2 for progress monitoring tools (.5 day)

<u>Costs</u>

- Total Estimated Costs \$20,950 (1st Year), (Approximately \$8,00-\$10,000 for subsequent years)

Implementation Schedule

On the Cost Estimate schedule, it states that an implementation schedule will be prepared according to our specifications upon receipt of that paperwork. It is proposed that we work in collaboration with the Technology Center for Teaching & Learning to craft a schedule which allows us to assess students during the first few weeks of school, followed by professional development for teachers and administrators regarding the use of reports, how to analyze / understand and apply the results for instructional planning.

Technical Needs / Issues

Since this is a web-based platform, all K-2 teachers need a mobile internet capable device. The most logical option is to provide these teachers with replacement laptops originally earmarked for $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grade teachers. Depending on the schedule, we may experience problems with bandwidth during the first testing cycle until our new 100 MB connection is up and running.
