By the numbers -

We have 187 students enrolled at Blue Ridge High School.

Average Daily Attendance Rate for the month of November was 89.3%.

Discipline data as of December 14th (and from 11/10-12/14):

 - Lunch detentions accounted for 26 instances.

- Before/After school detentions accounted for 3 instances.
- Saturday Schools 8 (0)
- In-School Suspensions 10 (4)
 - o 4 students received ISS during this reporting period.
 - Suspensions totaled 6.5 full days during this reporting period.
- Out of School Suspensions 4 (0)
 - No students received OSS during this reporting period.
 - Suspensions totaled 0 full days during this reporting period.
- Electronics referrals 52 (21)
 - o 32 students have received a referral for electronics.
 - 10 students have reached level 2.
 - 5 students are currently on a cell phone contract (level 3 and beyond).

Our Alternative Education students (through the Edgenuity program) have collectively completed 29 classes for a total of 22 earned credits as of December 13th. Fifteen students are currently enrolled in at least one hour of alternative education.

Here are some highlights from our daily announcements over the past month:

The high school Student Council wrote 225 Christmas Cards to the Farmer City Nursing Home and Rehab center to spread some holiday cheer.

FFA members traveled to Decatur to compete in the Section 16 Parliamentary Procedure and Conduct of Chapter Meetings events. In Parliamentary Procedure the team placed 1st overall with all 6 team members placing in the top 10. Lillian Enger placed 1st overall as the chair with floor members including Lori Weiss 1st overall, Mercedes Manuel 2nd overall, Carmen Ellis 3rd overall, Ava Paullin 4th overall, and Presley Hardesty 8th overall. Lillian Enger also had the highest overall score in the event. The Conduct of Chapter Meetings Team placed 1st overall. Drake Hardesty placed 1st overall as the President with floor members including Raeanna Miller 1st overall, Addie Browning 5th overall, Kelly Weiss 6th overall, Tyler Holtz 8th overall, Cheyanne Smith 10th overall, and Shawn Christie 11th overall. Drake Hardesty also had the highest score in their event. Both teams will be advancing to Districts in April for the 8th year in a row.

Leading our B team was Taylyn Watterson and Elias Nolan with 8 toss-ups each. It was great to see 5 former Blue Ridge scholastic bowl players come back and help with this tourney! Special shout out to our thespian troupe for providing a fantastic lunch.

The Boys Basketball Team took 2nd place at the Calvary Thanksgiving Tournament. Congratulations to Colin Michaels and Isaac Price who were both named to the all-tournament team.
