Academics

Science:

IPC: Students are beginning to discover thermal energy, and the laws of thermodynamics. English:

Additionally, to reduce learning gaps, the English department has committed themselves to at least 45 minutes of Lexia for each student each week. Teachers will monitor progress and use the data to help with differentiating strategies. English II:

The students are learning to examine more effectively elements of informational texts, including controlling idea, structure, point of view, main idea, audience, purpose, and inference. Additionally, the students are focusing on their writing skills; specifically, they are learning editing and revision strategies that will ensure effective written communication. Finally, English II students are utilizing thinking maps to compare and contrast information in two or more texts. The STAAR EOC is right around the corner, and the teachers are helping students prepare for success.
