BACKGROUND:

The Oliver Foundation is a nonprofit organization committed to the prevention of childhood obesity. It provides grants to schools and organizations across Texas to support initiatives that promote healthy eating habits and physical activity among children. The foundation's framework encourages schools to foster healthier food choices and increase the consumption of fruits and vegetables, often incorporating school gardens as interactive, hands-on learning tools.

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend approval of the MOU between BISD and the Oliver Foundation to support the One District, One Community, One Seed vegetable gardening initiative. Participating schools are Breeden, Brite, Burns, Canales, Champion, Garza at Southmost, Gonzalez, Hudson, Keller, Ortiz, Paredes, Pullam, Putegnat, Russell, Sharp, Vermillion, Villa Nueva, and Yturria Elementary Schools. The term of this MOU shall be made effective August 11, 2025 through May 28, 2026 and includes a grant award of up to \$5,000 to be used for the purchase of supplies to implement and maintain school vegetable gardens.

Please describe the program, projected outcomes and plans for sustainability that you anticipate being able to achieve with this grant.

The One District, One Community, One Seed district initiative provides a unified approach to promoting healthy living, environmental awareness, and student engagement through vegetable gardening. During the 2025–2026 school year, eighteen elementary schools will offer hands-on learning through outdoor gardening and physical activities. Students will participate in planting, tending, and harvesting vegetables while gaining valuable knowledge about where food comes from, why healthy eating matters, how physical activity supports wellness, and the importance of environmental responsibility. Teachers will implement the Learn, Grow, Eat & Go! curriculum to guide these lessons.

Expected Outcomes:

- -Increased student understanding of nutrition and healthy habits
- -More physical activity through outdoor garden work
- -Enhanced academic engagement in science, health, math, language arts, art, and more
- -Greater awareness of sustainability from a young age

To ensure long-term success and ensure sustainability, the gardening initiative is being integrated into the school curriculum (science, health, math, language arts, etc.). Schools have also established student garden clubs and actively encourage family and community volunteers to help maintain the gardens. Furthermore, BISD is working with Texas A&M AgriLife (Cameron County) to receive expert guidance and support.

This grant application is to request funding for supplies to support vegetable gardening at eighteen elementary schools. This opportunity will ensure all eighteen schools are equipped to fully participate in the One District, One Community, One Seed initiative and deliver consistent, hands-on garden-based learning experiences to their students.

Details:

- -Twelve schools already have existing garden beds. For these campuses, the grant will be used to purchase essential materials such as topsoil, compost, and seeds.
- -The remaining six schools are new to the program. For these campuses, the grant will provide the necessary supplies to build one new garden bed per school, including wood, screws, topsoil, compost, and seeds.
