BP 5112.2 Exclusions from Attendance

The School Board recognizes that there may be cases where denying admission is necessary because a student's presence in school presents a danger to the life, safety or health of students or school personnel.

The School Board may exclude children students from school because of a physical or mental condition which in the opinion of a competent medical authority will render the childstudent unable to reasonably benefit from the programs available or which will cause the attendance of the childstudent to be inimicable harmful to the welfare of other students.
