The following is a PDF copy of the 23-page 2024 Resolutions Committee Report.

Following is a summary review I created listing the pertinent information related to the Constitutional Amendment and Resolutions to be voted on during the 2024 IASB Delegate Assembly. After carefully reviewing all information, I recommend Bloomingdale Elementary School District 13 vote in accordance with the Resolution Committee's recommendations.

IASB Constitutional Amendment

- A. Proposed IASB Constitutional Amendment
 - 1. Article XI, Section 5 Parliamentary Practice
 - a. Description: Revise language to address potential inconsistencies between Roberts Rules of Order and IASB Constitution and IASB special rules.
 - b. Rationale for Amendment Roberts Rules of Order will continue to govern the IASB. This language resolves any conflicts between Roberts Rules of Order and the IASB Constitution. The Constitution/special rules will outrank Roberts Rules, provided no laws are broken.

Resolutions to be presented at the IASB Delegate Assembly

- A. New Resolutions = 10: Do Adopt = 6; Do Not Adopt = 4
 - 1. Dual Language (Do Adopt)
 - a. Description: IASB shall support legislation affirming that the attainment of the Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy shall satisfy the Illinois world language requirement for graduation.
 - b. Rationale for Do Adopt: Allowing reasonable alternative qualifications to meet the world language graduation requirement is a benefit for students.
 - 2. EBF Authorized Charter School Funding (Do Adopt)
 - a. Description: Urge adoption of Evidence Based Funding formula for State Authorized Charter Schools that aligns with the funding formula for every other public school in Illinois.
 - b. Rationale for Do Adopt: Current funding method is inequitable. EBF was enacted to ensure state funding based on unique needs of schools' student population. Charter School Funding should reflect the same principle.
 - 3. Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Accountability (Do Adopt)
 - a. Description: Advocate for TIF reforms that are sensible, responsible, keep communities whole and prioritize greater accountability to taxpayers.
 - b. Rationale for Do Adopt: Taxing bodies most impacted by TIFs should have a meaningful voice in the approval of TIFs and reform is needed.
 - 4. Faith's law Centralized State Agency for EHRs (Do Adopt)

- a. Description: Require ISBE or other appropriate entity to create a statewide database to fulfill the EHR requirement of Faith's Law.
- b. Rationale for Do Adopt: Fulfilling the requirements of the EHRs is burdensome. Creating a centralized entity for EHRs would streamline the process and allow for more accurate and consistent EHR completions.

5. Health Care Coverage (Do Adopt)

- a. Description: Require Illinois Department of Central Management Services to create a unified health plan for school districts to opt into to provide equitable insurance coverage to all school staff throughout Illinois.
- b. Rationale for Do Adopt: High costs for high quality health insurance and the limited availability of insurance plans in many counties is a serious problem. Providing an option to join Central Management Services would provide more choices while decreasing costs for school districts.

6. Polling Place – Amendment to Position Statement 7.08 (Do Adopt)

- a. Description: Update position statement to include "School districts should not be mandated to close on Election Day if none of the buildings used by students within the district serve as a polling place.
- b. Rationale for Do Adopt: If schools are not being used as a polling place, the safety of students is not at risk. This allows local control to decide if a district observes Election Day as a designated state holiday.

7. Cellphone Usage (Do Not Adopt)

- a. Description: Require school districts to create policy that states students may not use wireless communication devices during instructional time, except in certain cases.
- b. Rationale for Do Not Adopt: Agree that cellphone usage during school is a growing concern and research has shown that it can negatively impact instructional time and mental health. However, the Committee doesn't support a statewide mandate and believes this is best governed locally.

8. Office of Inspector General (Do Not Adopt)

- a. Description: Encourage legislation to create a state funded Office of Inspector General which would investigate allegations of waste, fraud, mismanagement, etc.
- b. Rationale for Do Not Adopt: Laws and processes are already in place that apply and legal remedies already exist to hold school districts accountable.

9. Faiths Law – EHRs for Current Employees (Do Not Adopt)

- a. Description: Revise Faith's Law to permit school districts to conduct Employment History Reviews(EHRs) for current employees in addition to new hires.
- b. Rationale for Do Not Adopt: Cause for confusion and pose legal and collective bargaining challenges. Keep employment decisions within local school districts.

10.Criminal Background Check (Do Not Adopt)

- a. Description: Require all school board candidates to have a criminal background check before they submit their petition.
- b. Rationale for Do Not Adopt: While it's critical that school board members maintain the highest ethical standards, this creates a different election standard compared to all other elected officials.

Resolutions not to be presented at the IASB Delegate Assembly

A. New Resolutions = 3: Do Not Present = 3

- 1. Constructional Change Mail-in Voting (Do Not Present)
 - a. Description: Allow in person and email voting.

- b. Rationale for Do Not Present: This is a revised version of a 2023 proposal that was also deemed Do Not Present. The committee determined that this proposal is a proposed Constitutional Amendment and not a resolution.
- 2. Constitutional Change Finance Section (Do Not Present)
 - a. Description: Support a constitutional change to the finance section associated with annual dues.
 - b. Rationale for Do Not Present: The committee determined that this proposal is a proposed Constitutional Amendment and not a resolution.
- 3. Faith's Law CANTS (Do Not Present)
 - a. Description: Consider using IL-DCFS CANTS to fulfill the Employment History Review of Faith's Law.
 - b. Rationale for Do Not Present: EHRs are cumbersome and a statewide centralized solution is needed. However, CANTS is not appropriate. This resolution is similar to a resolution submitted last year that was not adopted.
