Important Immunization Alert! If your child is in need of further vaccinations, a letter is enclosed outlining what is needed. *Please note that Oregon law has changed regarding nonmedical exemptions*. Nonmedical exemptions claimed prior to March 1, 2014 have been removed. In order to claim a nonmedical exemption, you <u>must</u> receive required education from a health care practitioner or by watching the online education modules provided by the Oregon Health Department. A letter is enclosed if this applies to your child. <u>Students out of compliance will not be admitted to school on exclusion day, February 17, 2016.</u>

Letter from the Principal

Dear NKN Middle School Community Members,

The first six weeks are in the books and the 2015-16 school year is off to a great start. We have a productive mix of 6th, 7th, and 8th graders this year who are working hard at meeting social and academic expectations. We also have decent sized population of 'new-to-the-area' students who are learning what it means to be a Raider. Overall, we are happy with the direction we are headed.

I want to take some time this newsletter to assure you how important school safety is in light of the events in Roseburg. No school community should have to live through that type of experience, and we all wish those fellow Oregonians spiritual and physical recovery. Here at NKN Middle School we train monthly on school safety issues, and lockdown drills is one of those ways. Students and teachers are trained to react to all types of emergencies, and as a district we have recently adopted a Standard Response Protocol. This protocol prepares the school, police departments, and other essential personnel to react swiftly to threats in and out of the building. You have my word that besides your child's education his or her safety is our number one priority at school.

In order for it to be our priority we rely on our instincts, local knowledge, and professional judgement in assessing every one of our students to make sure they remain healthy in mind and body. The middle school years can be a very emotional time for young people. They often don't contemplate the consequences for their actions and let impulse guide their decisions. We have a good team in place, including a Student Support Coordinator that monitors your children to make sure they don't fall through the cracks. Many of the perpetrators in these tragedies are students who have fallen through the cracks at some point in their childhoods, and we want to make sure we don't let that happen to any Neah-Kah-Nie students.

We maintain a positive attitude here and are proud to share that students are engaged with their teachers and peers and making lifelong connections to learning and friends. Our football team is have success on the gridiron, our volleyball team is once again competing with the best of them, and our cross country team hasn't never had this many participants. Add our great band program, science imagination club in the library, and honor society activities and we can proudly say there is a place for everyone.

And there is a place for parents as well. I encourage you to contact <u>raiderparents@gmail.com</u> for volunteer opportunities coming up. I also encourage you to sign up as a classroom volunteer if your schedule allows. Most, if not all middle school students have no desire to have their mom or dad here at school, but we can find you a place to help that limits your exposure to those OMG MOM! moments every middle schooler dreads.

Reminders

We have just a few items we would like to remind students and parents about. They are...

*As winter approaches, we may face school closures due to inclement weather. In addition to FlashAlert and the district web page, you may call the middle school office at 503-355-2990 for closure updates. When possible the district will initiate calls to all families via the automated call system.

*When providing permission for bus passes, please remember to include city, bus number, and bus stop location. *Please be sure to call the office (503-355-2990 or 866-966-2990) prior to 8:45 a.m if your student is going to be absent. We have a 24-hour phone message line and an automated call system.

*Students absent from school due to illness or unexcused absence are not permitted to attend after-school activities on the day of their absence.

*Middle school students are not allowed to carry medications. (This includes cough drops, aspirin, vitamins, etc.) Parents must check medications in and out at the office. *Unless specifically stated, the standard dress code applies to all school events and activities. Halloween costumes are not allowed.

*Students should not arrive at school prior to 8:15 am and 9:30 am on late start Wednesdays. Students not involved in extra curricular activities are not allowed to remain on campus after the end of the school day.

*The handbook provides clear guidelines for electronics. Students may not use cell phones while at school.

Mealtime



Meals at the middle school cost \$1.60 for snack and \$2.90 for lunch. The good news is that you can keep track of your student's meal balance by registering on MealTime On Line. You are not required to make on line deposits, although you may if you wish. You can even receive low balance warning emails, if you set your profile up that way.

To set up a MealTime On Line account:

- 1. Go to new NKN website (www.nknsd.org)
- 2. Click on "Parents"
- 3. Go to Mealtime Online and click the "login" button
- 4. Click on "create new profile"-- this is where parent info goes, including email address, and where the option to have low balance notifications can be checked.
- 5. Go to mealtime signin, and log in using the username and password you created.
- 6. Click on "Meal Account Deposits". This is where you will add your students to your profile. You will pick state and school and enter your student's name and student ID to set this up (contact the school office to get your student's ID number, if you don't know it).

Once your MealTime On Line account is set up, to check your student's balance, just:

- 1. Go to <u>www.nknsd.org</u>
- 2. Click on "Parents"
- 3. Log in to "Mealtime Online"
- 4. Click on "Meal Account Deposits"

Every year, eligibility for free or reduced meals "rolls over" for 30 days. October 20th marks the end of that time. If you believe your child should continue to qualify for free or reduced meals, and you have not reapplied for this year or received a notice from the district office, please reapply as soon as possible. You may do so online using the parent link at the district website, www.nknsd.org, or by completing a paper application available at the school office.
