Bobbi Newland - Chief Financial Officer:

The Spring Budget conference will be held in Albuquerque March 20-22. The district should learn the unit value for the 24/25 SEG, the indirect cost rate and other information for the 24/25 budget.

The 120-day student count occurred on 2/14/24. This and the 80-day student count have not yet been certified but the initial counts show a decline in enrollment that will decrease SEG funding for 24/25.
