- I) Call to Order: Meeting Called to order at 4:49 pm
- II) Roll Call fo Lsac Members: Toni, Jaclyn, Maxine is absent, Tisha
- III) Introduction of visitors: Katie, Julia, JW, Josh, Breanne, Chanel, Denali
- IV) Approval of agenda: Motion to amend agenda by Tisha. Add #4 under new business add Swearing in of new LSAC Member and reorganizing of seats. Jaclyn 2nd the motion, all in favor. Motion carried.
- V) Approval of previous minutes: Tisha Makes a motion to approve previous minutes. 2nd by Jaclyn. All in favor. Motion carried.
- VI) Student Reports: None Jaclyn says kids are doing great on fundraisers.

VII) Old Business

- 1) Carnival- 3/23/24 to 3/25/24 are the carnival dates. With a clean up day of 3/26. Kids food ordered plus the village put in a second order for student government. JW will give the list to Jaclyn. But the kids have decided to not open their store until carnival as they do not want to run out of things to sell.

- 1) Spring conferences: Parent teacher conferences are on March 14th. If some parents are no available then they can zoom teachers or email.
- 2) Pre-school: We are unsure why Maxine wanted this on the Isac meeting. We do know its because of some parents feeling like they are being targeted. We as an LSAC we understand that there is only one preschool teacher and she has 7 students. Chanel has stated that some of the kids have been pulled from school, she only has 4 students this week. Lsac recognizes that Olivia goes down to help Chanel, and maybe Olivia need to be talked to about how to handle kids' behaviors at school. Chanel has been going through Josh to talk to parents.
- 3) Deep clean school: Sickness have been back to back to back. Kids have been sick more than ever this month. LSAC would like the school deep cleaned, soft surfaces included with high traffic areas. We know Richard is the janitor and we as parents would like to donate our time and recourses to help disinfect the school. Maybe the students will get to do another son. Students have made stickers with their logo, and have already came in. Katie has looked into T-shirts being made out of Anchorage and it was reasonable, although hoodies were not reasonable. JW will deposit money soon. Hoodies are TBD right now as well as seat cushions and tote bags. As there is no cost-effective place to order them from right now. Katie is still looking for blankets to customize. Katie will not be here next year. This is officially her last year here after 9 years of teaching in Port Heiden. Katie will set up a google drive to share the student government info for teachers next year. Tisha asked to be added to the drive as it maybe helpful to have an LSAC member have access as well. Kids will be selling pizza for carnival. Parents please encourage students to participate and more importantly the students need to thank their volunteers. The last student government even two teachers got stuck with dishes and cleaning the kitchen and the students did not even thank them

- or help them. Katie did a dyslexia study with the kids and it was so great. Students are working on NYO right now. John wants encourage the kids to go to NYO and would like to see more of our kids go to state NYO.
- 3) Julia: She will be staying for half the year next year. She wants the kids to have an easier transition into the new school year without Katie. The kids have asked for Dwight and Linda back to teach. Julia will have a full class and may even take on some of Katies students. Olivia has been going down and teaching cultural classes to the kids.
- 4) Denali: this is her last LSAC meeting. Her internship is done at the end of the school year. She has really enjoyed working with all the kids. The council has been a big help in her work. The Isac would like for student code of conduct to be enforced, when necessary, and properly. We hope that those parents re-read the bullying policies and go to the schools staff in a proper manner.
