


Community Partnerships address Denton ISD's Mission Statement

History: Current Mentoring Programs



1980s: Denton ISD's Volunteer Advisory Board founded with mentors mostly parent volunteers



1990s: Denton ISD partnered with Denton Chamber to initiate: Denton Adopt A-School Program

1999: Expanded **to Adopt-A-School : Partners In Education** and initiated **COOL** (Community Offering One-on-One Learning – mentoring program)

2005 – Expanded mentoring with Ministerial Partners



2001: Initiated Grandparents in Public Schools with grandparents now mentoring throughout DISD.

2013 Community Partnership Initiatives

PHASE I:

- 2013 Goal: 1,000 mentors
 - As of Oct. 2 1,075 signups
 - 875 from UNT
 - 159 from Community
 - 29 from TWU
 - 12 from NCTC

CIS mentor applications completed: 559

CIS trained: 256

Phase 1:Communities In Schools of North Texas

- Serves as the primary provider for in-school dropout prevention programs in the North Texas region
- Identify students in need of mentors
- Help facilitate
 and monitor mentor matches
 and students' progress



Phase I: United Way of Denton County

 Denton County has more than 31,000 children at risk of dropping out of school

- <u>United Way - Community Needs Assessment</u>.

 Mentor Denton is a strategic education initiative for Denton community

 United Way partnering to help lower the number of at-risk students

Phase I: University Involvement

UNT's Center for Leadership and Service

 Committed to sign up 500 students and had reached 875 on Oct. 2

Helping to solicit an additional 500 volunteers

from the Denton area

TWU – Volunteer Services

 Signed up 29 by Oct. 2, working with athletic groups to recruit more

NCTC

Signed up 12 by Oct. 2



Phase I: Denton ISD

- Working closely with all community partnerships to recruit and assist in matching mentors with students
 - Increasing the number of mentors at schools where there are CIS programs.
 - Helping to recruit/train and match mentors
 - Creating pilot programs in schools where there are no CIS programs - in partnership with CIS.
 - Fred Moore High School initiated mentor program.
 - Working creatively with schools in staffing to assist with mentor programs.
 - Initiated a mentor program at Evers Park Elementary School
 - Exploring the expansion of Mentor Denton at Stephens Elementary



PHASE 2:

- Goal: Scaling to 10,000 mentors
 - Identify and expand with other existing Denton ISD mentoring programs to help students succeed at all levels
 - Develop a mentor/internship program for more high school students
 - Recruit business community to assist
 - Include church youth groups, sponsored athletic programs, library programs, etc.
 - Continue working with all Mentor Denton partners
 - Work with schools to enhance mentoring partnerships
