Labeling

<u>Please</u> make sure that your child's backpack, lunch box, and jackets are all labeled with their first and last name.

Snacks

Please send your child to school with two healthy snacks. Snacks should not include candy, soda or desserts. Thank you for helping keep their bellies full!

Lunch

Lunch is provided free of charge for all Madrona students. I suggest that you visit the Three Rivers School District's website to look at the lunch options for the week in case the options are not to their liking. If you choose to send your child to school with a lunch, please make sure it is labeled. Staff do not have access to a refrigerator or microwave. We appreciate your support with this.

Water Bottles

It's also helpful if you send a reusable water bottle to school each day with your child. Water bottles can be refilled at school and will be sent home everyday. We appreciate your support in keeping the little ones hydrated!

Folders

We have just placed an order for folders and your child will be given one hopefully next week. Folders should be sent back to school everyday. We look through them each morning for parent communication and we often send notes or letters home about important events on campus and/or notes about your child's day. It's important for organization and essential for communication. Please empty the folder each night as well.

Changes in Transportation

Please be sure to call the office with any changes in transportation. If your child takes the bus, we will send them home on the bus unless the office has been notified of a change by the parent and not the student.

Library

We are excited to begin visiting the library soon! Our library day is Thursday. Please be sure that your child returns their library book the following Wednesday so that they can borrow a new book for the week. I recommend putting the book back in your child's backpack when you're done reading it so that it's always there. Library policy is that new books can not be checked out until the overdue books are returned or paid for. Thank you so much for your help with this!

Homework

We do not have homework in kindergarten. We do send home phonemic awareness practice worksheets, high frequency word flashcards, games and decodable readers for extra practice. We encourage you to use these to work at home with your child to learn their letters, sounds, numbers and build phonemic awareness skills.

Some of this week's skills:

Reading/Writing: Summarize the plot of a story (beginning, middle and end). Identify the main idea of a story. Capitalize proper nouns. Genre of the week is humorous fiction.

Math: Review regrouping through the hundreds place (carrying and borrowing). Determine the value of a digit based on its place.

Science: Introduce the differences between weather and climate. Identify the components of the water cycle and how it relates to weather.


