Artwork from Denton ISD High School Students Featured on City of Denton Traffic Boxes

In collaboration with the city of Denton, 10 Denton ISD high school students' artwork is now prominently displayed throughout the Original Denton District as vinyl wraps on various traffic boxes. The state-designated cultural district extends from the Downtown Square to Carroll Boulevard, Quakertown Park, Prairie Street and portions of Southeast Denton, including Fred Moore Park.

Teachers from Braswell, Denton, Ryan and Guyer High Schools, and the LaGrone Academy, provided student art to be considered for placement on the traffic boxes. A subcommittee of the City of Denton Public Art Committee – the advisory board that helps guide the city's public art program – considered all submitted works and chose two winners from each campus.

The project is supported by a Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) grant. In 2022, Denton Parks and Recreation received the \$6,000 grant from TCA. An equivalent funding match from the City of Denton provided the budget to support printing and installation of the 10 traffic wraps.

Denton High senior Phoebe Richter received a perfect score on her ACT test, a college entrance exam used throughout the United States.

Only 0.25 percent of all test takers receive a perfect score on the ACT, which is graded on a 36-point scale. Last year, more than 1.3 million students nationwide took the ACT exam, meaning Phoebe was one of less than 3,400 students to receive a perfect score. The average score in 2022 was 19.8.

Denton ISD Business Office Receives Highest Possible Financial Rating for 21st Consecutive Year

For the 21st consecutive year, Denton ISD's Business Office has received the highest possible Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) rating from the Texas Education Agency (TEA). Denton ISD received an "A" superior rating for the 2022-2023 school year, receiving 98 out of a possible 100 points.

The state's school financial accountability rating system ensures that Texas public schools are held accountable for the quality of their financial management practices and that they improve these practices. The system is designed to encourage Texas public schools to better manage their financial resources to provide the maximum allocation possible for direct instructional purposes.
