for T-Mobile ‘Mobile Empowerment’ Program

At T-Mobile, we recognize that every student needs equal access to learning to succeed academically. Yet in homes across our country, 40% of all families with school-age children do not have high-speed internet at home. Without online access to complete homework, these disconnected youth fall further behind their peers.

T-Mobile’s Mobile Empowerment initiative is aimed at bridging the “homework gap” – the digital divide that exists between broadband internet connectivity at school and at home. We’re working to close that gap and empower students with the 21st century digital literacy and skills that will help them compete in today’s digital economy.

Eligibility Criteria

T-Mobile will invite individual public middle and high schools and districts to apply for access to the national grant program. Eligibility criteria for participation includes:

- At least 40% of the population receives free or reduced lunch at individual school sites.
- At least 15% or more of students are dropping out of high school (aggregate for all high schools if a school district is applying)
- At least 30% of the students are black and/or Hispanic
- At least 15% of students are not grade-level proficient in math and reading by the 9th grade

Monitoring Requirements

All recipients of the grant will be required to collect and submit quarterly reports to T-Mobile. Reports will contain both quantitative and qualitative data to measure the effectiveness of increased access on student achievement. Teachers, administrators, students and parents will be required to participate in biannual surveys used to measure perception, adoption and support/resistance levels to the program. In addition and most importantly, schools will be required to provide pre-and-post student performance data to quantitatively measure the impact of anywhere and anytime access.
