





**DATA SNAPSHOT:** Based on 24-25 SY ACT results, 85 students identified a first-choice university, indicating a high level of college aspiration. Of those students, 74% scored a 16 or above on the ACT. This is the foundational score for the purpose of our 5% growth goal for 25-26 SY.
