

Board Report June 27, 2016

1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. **From PBIS: As I reported last month, we did not make our goal this year. The PBIS Leadership Team is purposing using the same behavior goal for next year: "80% or more of the students in grades 7-12 will have either zero or one Behavior Report for the 2016-17 school year."**
- ii. **For the Class of 2017, 80% of this year's juniors completed the ACT+writing this past spring. Of those 66 students, 74% scored an 18 or higher on their composite score. A further breakdown of this data shows that 6% of the students tested earned a score of 30 or higher, 32% scored a 25 or higher, 53% scored a 22 or higher.**
- iii. **I wanted you to know how our seniors did in terms of how many College in the Schools (CIS) credits were earned by these graduates during their junior and senior year:**
