## STUDENT CONDUCT

Respect for the rights of others, consideration of their privileges, and cooperative citizenship shall be expected of all members of the school community. Respect for law and for those persons in authority shall be expected of all students as well. This includes conformity to school rules as well as general provisions of law regarding minors. Respect for the rights of others, consideration of their privileges, and cooperative citizenship shall also be expected of all members of the school community.

Respect for real and personal property; pride in one's work; achievement within the range of one's ability; and exemplary personal standards of courtesy, decency, and honesty should be maintained in the schools of this District.

The Superintendent shall establish a parent advisory committee an advisory discipline committee task force, including parents and two Board Members to assist the administration in developing procedures to carry out Board policy and philosophy, and shall hold all school personnel, students, and parents responsible for the conduct of students in schools, on school vehicles, and at school-related events. This task force shall meet at least annually with reports submitted to the Board.

Student conduct shall be governed by the rules and provisions of the **Student Handbook and the** Student Code of Conduct. This Code of Conduct shall be reviewed annually-by the advisory discipline committee task force, the Superintendent, and administration, and presented to the Board of Education prior to the beginning of each school year. It shall be readily available to students, parents, and staff on the District website and as part of the secondary Student Handbook.
