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Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth (MiPHY) Survey with 7th 9th, and 11th Grade Students, 2013-2024

About MiPHY Data

MiPHY stands for the Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth and is a voluntary and anonymous online student health survey provided by the Michigan Department of Education for use by local schools and school districts to assess the health related needs of their students.

The MiPHY provides building and district level reports on health risk behaviors reported anonymously by students in grades 7, 9 and 11 including substance use, violence, physical activity, nutrition, emotional health and sexual behavior. The survey also identifies risk and protective factors most predictive of these health risk behaviors. The MiPHY is offered every other year and is being offered in the 21-22 school year.

MiPHY reports, along with other school-based data, help school leaders make data-driven decisions to improve prevention and health promotion programming for their students.

ELPS participates in the MiPHY survey, which occurs every two years. ELPS uses the MiPHY data to assist in assessing and making data driven decisions about the district sexual health and HIV Prevention curriculum. The data related to sexual behaviors is presented in the following slides.





Middle School - ELPS Compared to Ingham County


Percentage of students who ever had sexual intercourse

- Percent of 11th Grade ELPS students who report having had sex (intercourse) increased since 2022, above the County rate.
- 9th ELPS students reported having sex at rates below County averages, and in 2024 reported lower rates than 2017 levels
- Percent of 7th Grade ELPS students who report having had sex (intercourse)dropped since 2022, below County rate



Percentage of students who had sexual intercourse for the first time before age 13 years (9th & 11th Grades)


Middle School - ELPS Compared to Ingham County

Percentage of students who had sexual intercourse for the first time before age 13 (9th & 11th Grades) or 11 (7th Grade)

- ELPS High School students who reported early sexual intercourse has declined since 2019-2020 and are currently well below County rates (n<8)
- ELPS Middle School students who report early sexual intercourse increased in 2022 just above county rates, but that number declined substantially in the 2024 survey




Middle School - ELPS Compared to Ingham County

Percentage of students who had sexual intercourse with four (9th & 11th Grades)/three (7th Grade) or more people during their life


- ELPS Middle School students report very low rates of having had three or more sexual partners
- ELPS 9th graders who report having had sexual intercourse with four or more people slightly increased since 2022, however it remains just below County rates
- The percent of ELPS 11th graders who report having had sexual intercourse with four or more people has been declining since 2020, but remains above reported ELPS student rates in 2018



% of students who had sexual intercourse with one or more people during the past 3 months (9th &11th)


Percentage of ELPS High School students who report having had sex with >1 person in the last three months

- 11th Graders reporting having had sex with one or more people in the last three months has increased since 2022
- Rates have remained constant for ELPS 9th graders since 2022 and just below County rates




Among students who had sex (intercourse) during the past three months, the % who drank alcohol or used drugs before last sexual intercourse

- ELPS students are consuming drugs/alcohol at their last sexual intercourse at rates above County averages, although trending down.
- Approximately half of middle school students who reported having sex within the preceding three months, consumed drugs or alcohol prior to their last sexual intercourse (From 58.3% in 2028 to 41.7% in 2024)



Of students reporting having sexual intercourse within the preceding three months, % who used a condom during last intercourse


- More than half of ELPS High School students report condom use at their last recent sexual intercourse.
- 80% of 9th grade ELPS students who had sexual intercourse within the preceding three months, reported condom use
- Condom use among ELPS 11th graders at their last recent sexual intercourse had followed just below the County trends until matching it in 2024.
- Condom use among 7th graders had remained consistent from 2020-2022, although the "n" was too small to generate a data point in the 2024 ELPS MiPHY report)

The percentage of students who used birth control of those who had sexual intercourse in the last three months


- ELPS 11th graders who report birth control use with their last recent sexual intercourse
- Number of ELPS 7th grade students reporting birth control use was too small to register a reported percentage in the MiPHY report for most survey years

Percentage of students who have ever been pregnant or gotten someone else pregnant


- ELPS 11th Graders reported higher rates of pregnancy than County in 2024, although still declining after a peak in 2019-2020.
- ELPS 9th grader pregnancy rates have remained low and lower that County trends since declining in 2019-20.

Percentage of students who have ever been physically forced to have sexual intercourse when they did not want to


- Rates of 9th Grade ELPS students who report forced sexual intercouse have been increasing since 2020
- 11th Grade ELPS students who report forced sexual intercourse has remained stable since declining from 2020 to 2022.
- ELPS High school students reported forced sexual intercourse at rates below, but close to, County data

Of students who ever had sexual intercourse, the percentage whose first partner was 3 or more years older


- ELPS 9th graders reporting their first sexual partner being more than three year older has increased just slightly above County rates
- ELPS 11th graders reporting their first sexual partner being more than three year older has decreased since 2020 below County rates



Percentage of students who have ever had same sex sexual contact

- 9th grade ELPS students have increased experience of same sex sexual contact, while 11th and 7th graders have decreased.
- Middle School ELPS students who had experienced same sex sexual contact had been steadily increasing since 2018 before declining between 2022-2024, dropping away from the County trend.

Middle School - ELPS Compared to Ingham County



Percentage of students who identify as gay, lesbian or bisexual.

- The percent of ELPS Middle school students who identify as LGB follows the County trends.
- Middle school students who identify as LGB had increased over 2019-2022, but then declined from 2021 to 2024.
- ELPS High School students who identify as LGB has increased since 2017, and closely align to County percentages in 2023-2024.

MiPHY Sexual Behavior Survey Observations

Sexual Activity Rates

- 11th Graders: The percentage of students who reported having sex increased since 2022, surpassing county rates. 9th Graders: Rates are below county averages and have decreased since 2017, though those reporting four or more partners slightly increased since 2022.
- 7th Graders: Reported rates of sexual intercourse dropped below county rates.

Trends Over Time

- High school students' early sexual intercourse rates have declined since 2019-2020 and are currently well below county averages.
- Middle school students saw an initial increase in early sexual intercourse in 2022, but this has decreased significantly by 2024.

Condom and Birth Control Use

- Over half of high school students used condoms during their last intercourse, with 80% of 9th graders reporting condom use.
- Birth control use among 11th graders remains above county averages, but the sample data for 9th graders and 7th graders was too small to report for several reporting years (difficult to trend).

Pregnancy Rates

11th graders reported higher pregnancy rates than county averages, though these rates are declining from a peak in 2019-2020. 9th graders' pregnancy rates remain low.

Substance Use

A significant percentage of middle school students (around 42%) who had sex in the last three months reported consuming drugs or alcohol, down from 58.3% in 2020.

Forced Sexual Intercourse

Reports of forced intercourse among 9th graders have increased since 2020, while 11th graders' rates have stabilized after a decline.

Age Difference in Partners

More 9th graders report their first partner being more than three years older, whereas 11th graders have seen a decrease in such reports.

Same-Sex Sexual Contact

9th graders' experiences with same-sex sexual contact have increased, while those of 11th and 7th graders have decreased.

Lesbian, Gav and Bisexual Identification

The percentage of middle school students identifying as LGB has decreased after a prior increase. High school students identifying as LGB have increased and now align closely with county trends.

District Sex Education Assessments

About Pre-and-Post Surveys

Students' attainment of ELPS approved sex education and HIV prevention learning objectives is measured with pre and post surveys.

These may be administered anonymously at grades 4, 5, 6, & 7. High school students complete pre and posttests that are graded as part of the Health Class.

Collection of this data is used to evaluate the effectiveness of the program and to report progress to the community and the state in a biannual report by the ELPS Sex Education Advisory Board.

Pre/post-tests indicated that students had some deficits in key areas of HIV and sex education, and the instructional program significantly increased students' knowledge and skills.

The content that demonstrates strong improvement:

- 4th Identifying and talking to a parent or trusted adult about puberty
- 5th Identifying and talking to a parent or trusted adult about puberty, deciding to wait to become an adult before becoming a parent., and recognizing body language and words that express consent.
- 6th Identifying strategies to use when negative or unwanted sexual behavior occurs, identifying positive communication skills in healthy relationships, and identifying and talking to a parent or trusted adult about puberty

The content that appears to need reinforcement:

- 4th Identifying social/emotional changes and anatomy/body changes that happen during puberty, and recognizing body language and words that express consent.
- 5th Recognizing signs of being physically able to reproduce, and identifying social/emotional changes that happen with puberty
- 6th Understanding brain changes during puberty, mechanisms of STI transmission, and respecting intersectionality; and

- For Middle and High School, there were some issues with executing pre and post evaluations and recording the results. There was no usable Middle School evaluation data available for the 2022-2024 report period.
- At the high school level, the data available represents one of the two instructional classrooms.
- Overall, the pre/post-tests for High School students indicated that students had significant deficits in key areas of HIV and sex education, and the instructional program significantly increased students' knowledge and skills.
- Process improvement steps are being put in place for the 2024-2025 instruction year to consistently and accurately capture pre-and-post instruction evaluation data for the Middle and High School building levels.
