Board Update
TAKS and TAAS Results for Exit Level—October 2006**

On October 17 through 20, eligible high school students took exit exams in Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS). The TAKS test has four sections—English language arts (ELA), mathematics, science and social studies. Students must pass all sections to graduate.

Students were eligible to take the TAKS exit test in October if they had taken it last year and failed it or if they are on an accelerated track to graduate early in May 2007 and had been in tenth grade last year. Students wishing to graduate in May 2007, have two (2) more testing opportunities in spring 2007.

Five of them needed to pass science, another one needed math only and one other needed science and language arts. Unfortunately, none of them passed the tests they needed. They may return as many times as they want for tutoring and testing opportunities.
