# **CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION**

The new Wonders and Study Sync implementation is underway. As expected, with years of SFA, the new ELA framework is a learning curve. There are frustrations, however professional development is ongoing, not only from our consultants, but through our instructional coaches.

The district writing assessments were administered Oct 9-13<sup>th</sup>. At present the writing assessors are busy scoring all the papers/bluebooks and results are being uploaded to the shared drive. Will report results on the next board report.

The district walkthrough document has been created for all Principals, Asst Principals, Superintendent and Director of Curriculum and Instruction. This tool will provide data on whether or not we are seeing what is expected in classrooms over time.

In order to serve our EL students more efficiently and to make monitoring easy for teachers, we purchased a database called Ellavation. The database allows teachers to look at all their EL students, insert strategies been used and receive assessment data. We are almost operational. A few more upload and we should be good to go for November.

This data base replaced have a folder for each EL student in the CUM file, which made it difficult when more than one teacher needed the ino.




