Happy New Year!!!

Welcome back, we hope that you had a relaxing and eventful winter break. We are glad to be back into session and running the home stretch to the end of the first semester. It always amazes me at which how guickly the year goes. With the end of the first semester and the beginning of the second, there are many activities that students and staff are preparing for, a few of those are:

Sophomore/Junior Science Testing: Starting this month the students in the Sophomore class along with students in the Junior class will be completing the OAKS science assessment. These assessments are beneficial in providing feedback on where students are at as well as reflect on the school rating from the state.

Senior Project Presentations: On January 14th, the senior class of 2016 will be presenting their projects to members of the community as well as volunteers from the school district. The project as well as the presentation are a piece of the senior forum class and are required for graduation. Thanks to those that are volunteering your time to assist our students.

End of the First Semester: During the week of February 1st students will be completing finals for the first semester, which concludes on the 4th. The grades that students earn are the grades that will go on their transcripts. At the start of the year the staff set goals to have a minimum of 85% of students passing their classes. As the semester draws to an end please be in touch with your students teachers regarding their progress and needs, furthermore have conversations with your students about completing assignments and assessments that will impact their grade.

School Accreditation: This year Illinois Valley High School is up for Accreditation renewal. This is a certification from the state that happens every five years which allows our students access to postsecondary colleges and universities. Part of the accreditation process is a survey that is completed by our parents, we will be sending these surveys home with your student in the middle of January, we will also be emailing a link to take the survey electronically to the emails that you provide on your student's enrollment packet. Either way, please be looking of the survey as your feedback is valuable to our accreditation process. Oregon Immunization Partners

Senate Bill 895 made a change to school immunization law this year: old religious exemptions signed prior to March 2014 are no longer valid. Options for parents of children with old religious exemptions include:

1. Provide documentation of immunization, or

2. Complete the new process for a nonmedical exemption by getting education from a health care practitioner or from the online video available at <u>www.healthoregon.org/vaccineexemption</u> This is a great opportunity for clinics to discuss vaccines with parents who claimed an exemption for their child years ago.

Illinois Valley High School Attendance and Tardy Policy

Parents and/or guardians have the responsibility to send their child to school on a consistent basis. Revised Statutes, **ORS 339.030**, "Every pupil who has not completed the 12th grade and is between the ages of 7 and 18 years, is required to attend school during the entire school year. Students have the responsibility to report to school and classes on time and be prepared to learn. Irregular attendance is defined as eight (8) unexcused absences in any four week period. Irregular attendance will generate contact from resident school personnel. Parents should speak directly to the resident school staff to resolve attendance issues. Absences include full day, partial day or selected class period absences."

If students are not attending school on a regular basis, it becomes extremely difficult to keep up with the coursework. Students who are missing **8 or more** days (that are not excused by a doctor) will from this point on be subject to school discipline.

Tardy Policy

The staff and Administration at Illinois Valley High School expect **ALL** students to be in class and to be on time every day with materials out and ready to learn. In order to pursue the excellence we seek, it is imperative to have this be our common practice. Students at Illinois Valley High School have ample passing time as well as a lunch and two breaks during the day.

Infractions for Unexcused Tardies

- 3rd, 5th, and 7th Tardies.....Lunch Detention
- 9th and 11th Tardies......In School Suspension
- 13th + Tardies......Parent and student meeting with Administration for additional consequences.
- Additional Consequences may be extra lunch detention, In School Suspension, Out of School Suspension, revocation of ability to park on campus, or behavior contract.

COMMUNICATIONS: SYNREVOICE—AUTOMATED VOICE MESSAGING & ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATIONS

We will use **Synervoice** to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using **Synervoice**, it is important that you say **"Hello"** as this triggers the mes-



sage. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.

At this time, our Attendance Clerk, Tani Becker, personally follows up on absences on a daily basis, If your student missed all or part of school, please call the school by the next morning to clear your student's absences. The number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. You may also send Ms. Becker an email to verify or excuse an absence or tardy: *tani.becker@threerivers.k12.or.us*. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students will receive a disciplinary referral for un-cleared absences.

What is Remind and what makes Remind safe?

Remind is a free communication platform built for teachers.

Remind allows teachers to safely and efficiently communicate with students & parents about important classroom information and school activities. Participants sign up as a student or parent and choose to receive messages by text, email, or in our app.

We know that privacy and security are important issues when dealing with teacher-to-student and teacherto-parent communication. We have worked hand in hand with administrators and teachers to design key product features based on those concerns.

Here is a bit more detail about our free messaging service and the restrictions we have in place to ensure privacy and safety:

No exchange of personal information: Remind messages are not sent from personal cell phone numbers. Students/parents who sign up to get messages through Remind do not gain access to a teacher's personal cell phone number, nor will the teacher ever have access to a student or parent's personal information. (Students and parents opt themselves into messages.)


Logged communication history: A log of all announcements and chat history are saved in the teacher's account and on our server. These messages cannot be edited or deleted. This means an accurate log of communication history will always be at your fingertips should anyone question the content that you have or have not sent, and the message history is easily available for export.

Report to Remind: Keeping Remind safe is our priority, but it is a shared responsibility. We have posted our Community Guidelines to help everyone understand how to stay safe on Remind. If you need to report anyone to Remind, you may choose *Report* by clicking on any participant's name after clicking on the (i) info button.

Personal information never shared or sold: We do not rent, share, or sell user information with anyone. The only people with access to anonymous user data are the ones needed to operate our service. It's important to us that we only use your user information to operate our service. We do not rent or sell your information ever.

Teachers have been seeing huge benefits from adding text messaging into their teaching strategy. We see increases in homework completion, improved test scores, class participation, parent involvement, and overall student motivation on a regular basis.



meet our sparrow

Illinois Valley High School Sparrow Brooke Davis

Roxy Davis was 20 weeks pregnant when she and her husband Jason were told that their unborn baby girl had hydrocephalus. Hydrocephalus is a condition where cerebrospinal fluid doesn't reabsorb properly in the brain, causing a harmful build-up. This extra amount of fluid greatly increases pressure inside the skull, can cause the head to be enlarged, and can lead to many other serious medical conditions as well.

Precious baby Brooke was born at 37 weeks on October 28th, 2014, and spent her first month of life in the NICU, due to problems with breathing and eating. Brooke underwent her first brain surgery to try and relieve fluid accumulation at only two months old. Since then, she has had three additional brain surgeries, for a total number of four...all before her first birthday. During her fourth surgery, doctors installed a shunt on the right side of her head in order to help with the ongoing need for fluid to drain from her brain into her spine, where it then reabsorbs into her body.

In addition to hydrocephalus, it was discovered that little Brooke was missing part of her brain called the corpus callosum (the band of white matter that connects the two hemispheres of the brain.) As a result, Brooke has experienced some delays in development. She does not yet crawl, but receives physical and occupational therapy twice a month.



Since January of 2015, Brooke has had to travel to Portland for hospital visits over 15 times, with many more trips likely to be in her future. Even with these challenges, Brooke has many good days. She likes to be outside, loves her bounce chair, and is adored by her 3-year-old big brother, Bentley

Brooke will be adopted as a Sparrow to Illinois Valley High School in Cave Junction. Students at IVHS will work hard to raise money for Brooke through sponsored community service and fundraising projects.

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During School Hours



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It is always our goal to help students learn, succeed, and thrive, and, as parents/ guardians, you know that healthy eating is one tool that is beneficial.

We encourage our students to eat during the regularly scheduled breakfast and lunch times. We do understand that there may be times when this does not work as planned.

As a supplemental time, the school schedule provides a morning break, and, for most of the week, an afternoon break, which allows students to grab a quick snack or drink, should they choose to.

If you need to bring food/drink to the school for your student, please understand that there is a guideline in place that will not allow class time to be disrupted.

The process of how food and/or drinks are delivered to students during regular class time hours will be as follows:

- ⇒ ANY food or drink brought to the school for a student will be delivered at a break time (morning or afternoon), or at the beginning of lunch.
- \Rightarrow Food/drinks left for student athletes, or, students going on a school-sponsored field trip, will be able to it pick up **BETWEEN** classes, or, on their way out to the bus.
- \Rightarrow NO food or drink will be delivered to a student during ANY class time periods.
- ⇒ Please pay close attention to the daily lunch time when delivering your student food. Allow enough time for him/her to eat what you have brought, without being tardy to the next class.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact our office.

During School Hours

We encourage ALL parents/guardians and students to adhere to the Three Rivers School District/ Illinois Valley High School policy regarding the use of cell phones during school hours.

Students are allowed to carry their cell phones on their person while on school campus. While in class, however, students are asked to keep their phones in either their backpack or locker. Certain circumstances **MAY** allow the use of cell phones in the classroom with permission.

Students are NOT allowed to use their cell phones while in the office.

If you need to contact your student during school hours, please contact the school, we will get a message for him/her to call you as soon as the current class is done. If it is an urgent situation, or an emergency, we will get your student to the office at that time.

The following is a brief guide for basic cell phone usage. Please refer to the student handbook for detailed information, or, contact the office.

Cell phones CAN be used;

Cell Phone Policy

- Before/After school
- During lunch time and morning/afternoon break
- Special classroom assignments ONLY where permission is granted.

- **DURING CLASS TIME** (Including but not limited to texting, social media, internet surfing, photographing/recording).
- IN THE OFFICE (Students may use the office phone to call a parent for emergency purposes only).

Khan Academy – www.khanacademy.org This website has over 4,000 videos on subjects from geometry to chemistry to computer science. This is a great tool that actually reteaches the material step by step. Many times hearing the concept explained by someone else makes that light bulb turn on and the student understands. Interactive practice is also available to solidify the concepts.

Sophia – www.sophia.org Video clips are also available at Sophia, but there is also much more. Over 28,000 tutorials including slideshows and screencasts are available anytime. The site also tailors the information according to the student's learning style, which is determined through a short quiz.

Quizlet – www.quizlet.com This is a great study tool. There are thousands of flash cards & quizzes on the site developed by students and teachers from around the world in nearly every subject you can think of. Students can use an already created tool or create one of their own to challenge themselves and others in their class. This is a great vocabulary tool.

ODYSSEY WARE

ODYSSEYWARE is an on-line academic website which provides innovative, 21st century learning opportunities for our students.

Three Rivers School District/Illinois Valley High School uses this program for students outside of the regular classroom setting, and for students that need to do make up classes (Credit Retrieval) to be eligible for graduation.

ODYSSEYWARE (OW) is web-based, If you have internet access, your student can access his/her assignments, which allows them the ability to complete the courses as fast as he/she needs to, whether they are in the classroom or at home.
