Welcome to Tracy Schmerber – new Community Representative. Mike gave her a general overview of what the Community Engagement Committee's purpose is.

Facility Use Applications to be processed:

- Westview Cheer Clinic November 2, 2012
 Fundraiser that will bring in younger kids to teach them basics of cheer.
 Requested the Gym & Cafeteria. Will need a custodian \$53/hr for a total of \$212.00. Approved.
- Westview Winter Classic, sponsored by Westview Band, has been turned in – although there are a couple items to be clarified/confirmed before we need to approve it. Will be March 22, 2013 from 4pm – midnight for set up and March 23, 2013 from 5am – midnight. Tabled until next month.

Requests will be coming in for banquets for fall sports. Most will be handled internally as they are requested.

The question was raised – regarding priority given for events / sports. Each coach is given 2 events and there is a priority for In-district requests over Out-of-District requests.

Principal's Report

- Homecoming it was a great week. We had good assemblies 2 of the same in order to accommodate the school in the same day. The game was huge – largest attendance ever. There were a little of 1000 kids at the homecoming dance and no issues at the dance.
- 2) Club Rush is this week lots of clubs and activities available for interested kids. All clubs have to have an advisor some clubs are finding that a little difficult as the advisor that was formerly with them may have been transferred and not at Westview any longer, but the kids have been very understanding are figuring out how to work out any issues.

- 3) Back to School night was Wednesday, 10/3. Had the opportunity to have it during Homecoming week, but chose to bump it back one week, then had to compete with the Presidential Debate. Not ideal either way, but there was a good turn-out and there was positive feedback from teachers and parents.
- 4) Synergy. This has been a struggle. Continue to have issues with it and one gets solved only to have another crop up. For instance, Aloha HS and Sunset HS had both entered seating charts pictures of the charts only to have them disappear. Another issue was 3 teachers had input grades only to have them all disappear. 2 teachers had back-up notes, the 3rd didn't. It's definitely a system where the bugs and/or commands can affect aspects of the program without realizing the how or why. The Vendor continues to customize it as needed, but as it continues to be utilized in the district, they continue to have to work out issues. Even Synergy trainers are finding that the troubleshooting can take 90 minutes to fix/determine the error. Parent access should be by February 1.
- 5) Westview was able to hire 2 additional instructional aides. Due to funds saved from Unemployment \$'s, there was enough allocated to Westview for the aides. Staff was consulted and they agreed to one for the English department & one for the Math department.
- 6) Enrollment numbers We were anticipated at 2425 and we are at 2440. Overall the district is very close to their projections.

Question was raised regarding the new Science Curriculum – the teachers really enjoy the Physics / Chem / Bio Stem that they are teaching. There has been a lot of team building and team teaching within this department. During the summer, the decision was made to organize the teachers into teams where they can share ideas, classrooms, kids, etc. They all have the same plan time as well & an instructional aide for that department. It seems to have been a good decision as they are all working well together.

Parent Complaint Regarding Approved Facility Use Application for the After School Care Program (currently renting our cafeteria from 3:05-5:45 on school days)

- ∞ A written complaint regarding the program had been submitted. A family felt that they had been abruptly dismissed from the program.
- ∞ This is the third complaint of this nature. In November 2011 and January 2012, other families called the school with similar complaints.
- ∞ Eric noted that there seems to be evidence to suggest that the provider does not have a clear written notification system for handling student discipline.
- ™ Heather believes that up front notification would prevent concerns of this
 nature coming to the committee. A written agreement, signed yearly by the
 family and student is often standard at other childcare centers. A written
 agreement stating which behaviors result in immediate dismissal from the
 program, which behaviors result in a written warning before dismissal and
 which student behaviors result in a series of interventions supported by the
 parent and provider and for how long before dismissal would provide the
 committee with evidence to show that there is a clear system for handling
 student discipline.
- Laura suggested that we continue to monitor complaints and whether the provider has written documentation to show families involved in making the complaint were informed of the process.
- → Heather noted that our committee should provide each Facility Use User with clear written expectations about our expectation (in the form of mtg. min.) so that the provider has warning that there is a possibility of the agreement being terminated (with 30 days written notice) or not renewed in future years
- ∞ Laura recognizes that on-site childcare after school provides a valuable service for our families.
- ∞ Information on this discussion will be shared with the provider.

Meeting was called to order at 9:40AM. The meeting included call to order, Principal's remarks, previous business, new business, building use requests, and adjournment.

Public Input: None

Principal's Remarks:

- Enrollment is staying about the same as the beginning of the school year; a little less than 700 students.
- Mrs. Chelf's 4th grade class is the largest at 36 students.
- Teachers are being supported with great volunteer help.
- Friday, October 12th is a no school day for students. Hiteon staff will be participating in a Michael Grinder: ENVoY Workshop along with seven other area schools. This program is designed to show educators how to use influence rather than power to manage the classroom.

Previous Business:

New Business:

- Stacie Ayers is joining us as an official Hiteon Community Engagement Committee member.
- Stacie raised a concern about school handwriting being taught consistently. Zaner-Blosor is the standard for handwriting. Mrs. Hansmann will verify that everyone is on board with the standard.
- Certified staff is required to attend three night events such as Back to School Night, Music Programs, Science Fair etc. Evening conferences are not included.
- Discussed how best to use PTC funds to support school needs. Ideas include: benches, track, playground
 equipment, writers or artist in residence. The PTC is going to survey parents and staff for suggestions. Mrs.
 Hansmann reiterated that using funds to support teaching and learning will always be her top priority. The
 \$10,000 given by the PTC for technology has been used to purchase items on her 3-5 year technology plan for
 making sure classrooms have SMART boards, projectors, elmos, and speaker systems, as well as outfitting the
 technology lab with enough workstations to support the larger class sizes.
- More discussion on collaboration/late start. Collaboration focuses on student growth in three areas: reading, writing and math. The district is sending out a teacher survey about the Learning Team Proposal. There will be a Learning Team Information Night for parents on October 23rd.
- Site Council Members are parents (MaryPat Janowski, Sharon Friedman and Keeley Haugen) and staff (Fran Sinapi, Jamie Lapp, Megan Nace, and Sean Leverty). Their focus is math and writing.

Ken, Principal's Report: blue folder, teacher and parent led committee, NOT Principal directed (Thank you for coming)

One of the most critical committees

1991, Site Councils established in Oregon: Legislature felt parents/community needed to be more involved 20/20 Grant 1980s at AHS, we helped testify as to the benefits

not a management tool (not to discuss the skirt lengths of Analanis)

We are like a Board of Directors, set policy, monitor policies, big picture vision

We will set the tone, Thank You, best thinking needed

Scores went up: State Report Card Rudy Crew (NYCity Schools-growth models)

Newsweek, top 6% of schools, 5th in Oregon

Perfect Storm: huge curriculum changes in science/new student data base, lots of glitches,

Synergy/personnel changes 11 lay-offs, 18 transfers in, 16 transfers out/schedule change, trimester → semester/class sizes

But: 60% less discipline problems/ 1/3 the kids in suspension rooms

How long can teachers take the big classes?

How long can our neediest kids keep "listening" to more lecture style classes?

Discipline spikes right after grades come out, we will see how we are doing Same problems at other 48 schools? (Jahed)

Our class sizes are lower, because of mobility and poverty, we have the highest poverty allocation (we have lowest class sizes in the district)

Tyrone: Discipline? What steps are taken when kid acts out in class?

- 1. Solve in class. (Staff is really responsive to needs of kids)
- 2. Write referral, to VicePrincipal or to 9th-Grade Team Leader, Dennis Joule
- 3. Or Detention Room, Mr. Bates
- 4. Administrator takes steps as needed
- 5. Principal takes expulsion issues (drugs, weapons, etc.)
- 6. Counselors near Admins (help as needed to know the troubles)
 - a. Can connect families with county agencies
 - b. Cannot recommend different specific programs
