Food Service Building Report

The Food Service Program total meals served for the month of December 2025 are below;

SNP:

Breakfast: 15,448 (13 days of meals)

Lunches: 19,790 (13 days of meals)

Supper:

272 (13 days of meals)

The Food Service Program is prepared for the upcoming holiday/meal and winter break. We had another freezer/cooler clear-out on December 15th, this helped eliminate food waste/spoilage while the students/staff are on break. And, the cooks prepared a daily menu based on what is in their coolers/freezers (menu is subject to change). Staff worked with their building head cooks for special diet orders/allergies for students.

The Supper Program has had an increase during the beginning of November and slowly decreasing in count/participation as we approach the holidays. We are expecting a decrease in count for the rest of December. Due to the holiday season/weather (wind), there was a decrease in count for December. The Southern Piegan Health Clinic paid for all adult meals for parents/guardians/families that ate dinner with the children for the month of November only (see attached letter). The annual renewal application for the Supper Program through the Child and Adult Care Program (CACFP) has been completed/approved for 2025-2026.

The Napi kitchen had a new renovation which was an installation of a new floor. At this time, the Napi kitchen now has a new warmer, salad bar server, and a new floor. The students and staff now have nice warm food and the salad bar is now cooled to temperature at serving time. These new items and the installation of the new floor were much needed for the daily operations of food service. This was not made possible without the help/assistance of the School Board, Superintendent, Finance Director, Maintenance Department, and Food Service Program.

The Ware house staff has been working very hard daily to carry out their daily operations including the assistance they provide for the school kitchens, food deliveries, and mail. And, the new fork lift has made daily operation in the warehouse a lot easier to build/distribute food orders. In addition to new equipment; the new building does have a building buzzer similar to the Administration building. So, all visitors can now buzz in the building and no longer have to wait to get in the building.

The copy center clerk has been very busy with district copies, and getting ready for the upcoming events.

The food service program does not have vacancies at this time. All vacancies have been filled for each kitchen. The most recent hire was for an assistant cook for the Supper Program.

The food service program will be getting ready for the upcoming events. We will have our 1st Indigenous recipe of the season for all BPS on February 26th (Bison Nachos). We look forward to providing nutritious meals to the students and happy tummies!
